Raiders survive another late scare to dump Stars and win Ontario title

The Georgetown M&M Pro Sports Minor Atom Raiders rewarded themselves and their fans after a wild ride on an emotional roller coaster. The Raiders staved off a late comeback to down the Richmond Hill Stars 4-2 and win the Ontario Minor Hockey Association championship.

"It couldn't happen to a finer bunch of kids," said Raider coach Jack Moon. "I couldn't have found a better team to coach."

The minor atoms became the first Georgetown team to win an OMHA title since the juveniles beat Grimsby for the provincial AA championship in 1987-88.

While the Raiders were able to savor the victory afterward, Sunday's fifth and deciding game was beginning to look all too familiar. The Raiders built a 3-0 lead through two periods but like the Stars did in the previous two games, they rallied in the third.

The recipe for disaster was there as the Raiders began the third two men short, but Georgetown managed to kill both penalties. Richmond Hill was able to sustain the momentum and the Stars broke Chris McCulloch's shutout bid and then pulled to within one with 6:07 to play.

"We dominated the game as usual but they came on very strong for seven or eight minutes and that's when they got

both goals," said Moon. "The guys didn't get down at all. They were still cheering each other on the bench."

McCulloch still had to come up big to preserve the win. He turned the Stars away on a breakaway with five minutes to play and the Raiders managed to limit the Stars' chances the rest of the way until Richmond Hill got a faceoff in the Raider end with 25 seconds to play.

Kevin Field won the draw, getting the puck back to Travis Bland. He moved the puck ahead to Brad Torres, who dumped the puck into the empty Richmond Hill net to touch off the celebration.

Moon, who picked up his first OMHA title after three consecutive trips to the final, said a big Georgetown contingent helped keep spirits up.

"Probably three-quarters of the crowd was from Georgetown," he said. "A lot of them had nothing to do with our team. They were there from other rep teams and house league teams. It was great."

Field got the Raiders on the board in the first, scoring from James Mountford and Nick McLaughlin. The same trio hooked up for Field's second goal. Mark Boycott then scored what proved to be the winner, from Peter Tregunna, in the second.

The Raiders finished the regular season just one point out of first with a 16-6-6 record. Moon said the team started to show its potential around Christmas, just in time for the playoffs where the Raiders knocked off Oakville, Brampton and St. Catharines en route to the final.
