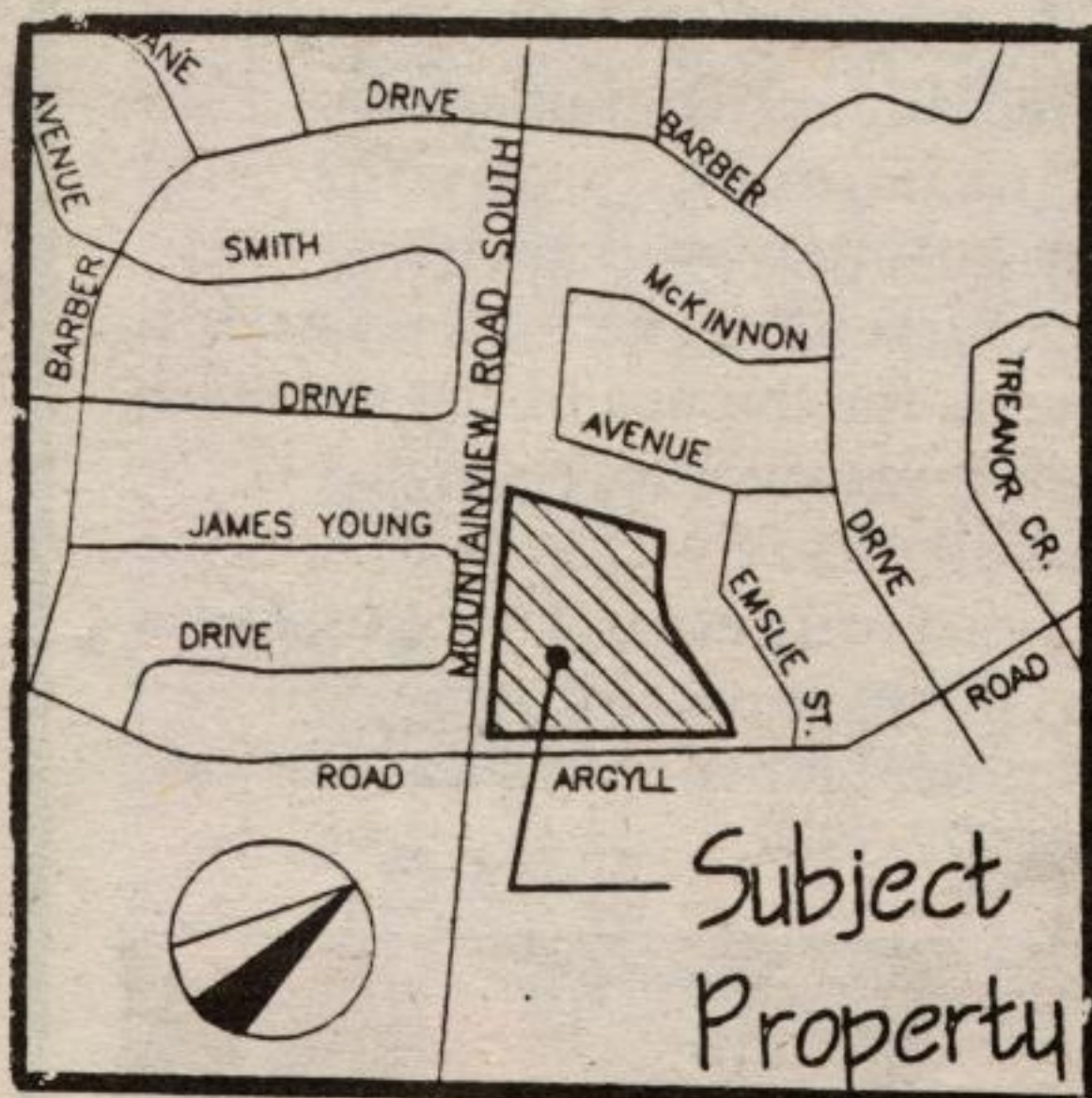


PUBLIC MEETING WARD 4 / ARGYLL ROAD / MOUNTAINVIEW ROAD

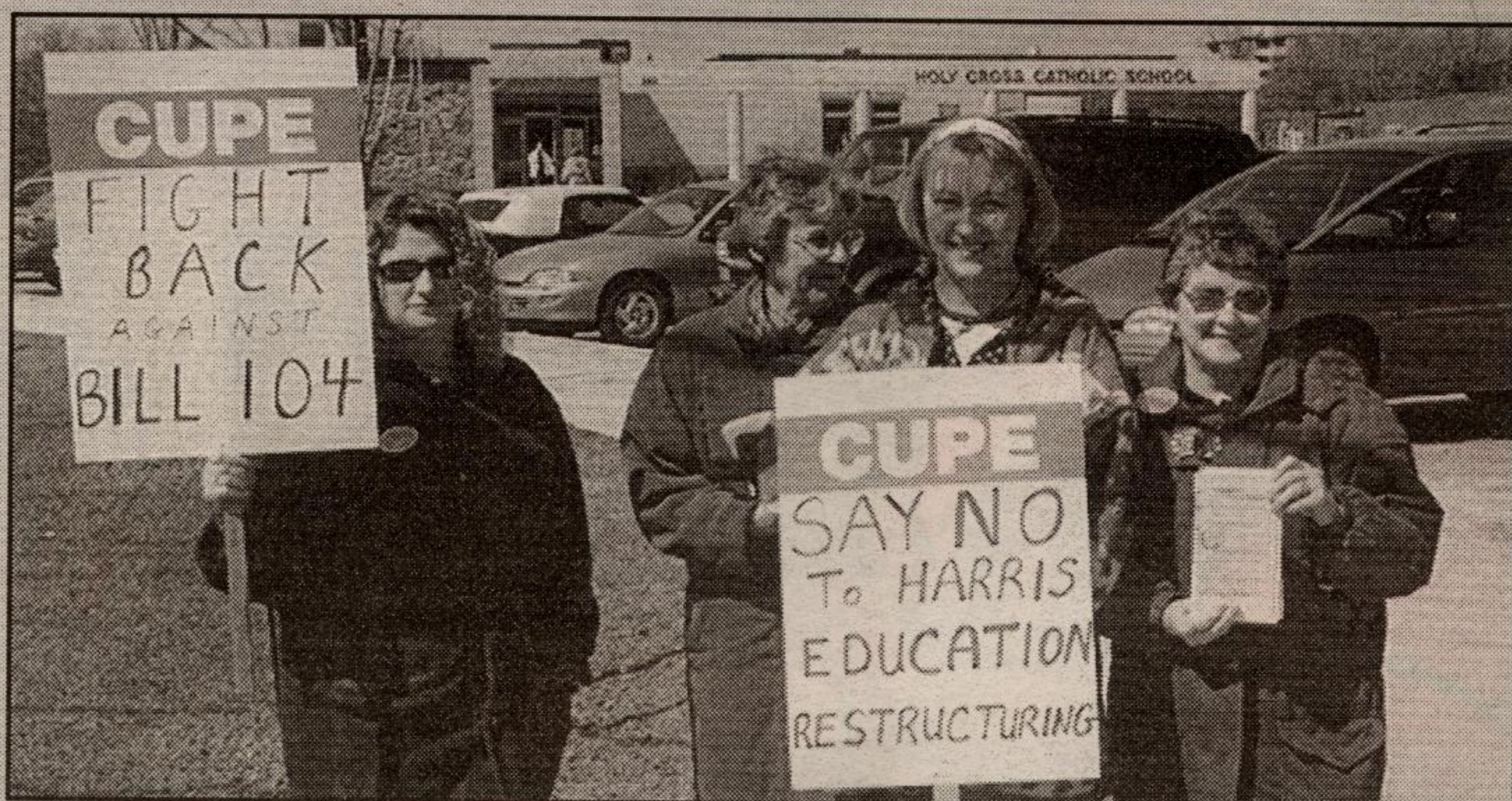

STORMWATER RUN-OFF HANDLING FROM COMPOST SITE

April 24, 1997

Halton has undertaken a study of the best means to remove stormwater run-off from the existing leaf and yard material composting operation. The study concluded that a variety of methods will be considered for the handling of the stormwater. The methods include spray irrigation, direct discharge and trucking to treatment plant.

This project is being planned as a Schedule C project under the Class Environmental Assessment for Municipal Water and Wastewater Projects. An open house is planned to provide further information to the public on the project and to receive input and comments from interested persons.

Subject to comments received as a result of this Open House, the Region plans to proceed with the planning for this project and an Environmental Study Report will be prepared and made available for public review.
