two-day truck blitz done Aby Halton police and Ontario Ministry of Transportation officers in Georgetown recently resulted in 23 trucks taken out of service and 35 charges being laid.

The blitz, which was part of Halton Regional Police Service's Spring Into Safety Campaign, was conducted last Wednesday and Friday in the parking lot at Gordon Alcott Arena. Const. Al Stennett said a total of 72 trucks, from gravel trucks to garbage trucks, were brought in from various streets in town including Maple Ave., Trafalgar Rd., Guelph St. and Mountainview Rd.

Of the 72, 40 received complete safety inspections, and 23 failed the inspections. Stennett said the blitz resulted in a 31 per cent failure rate.

Of the 23 trucks that failed the inspection, 17 drivers were able to repair the defects quickly and get back on the road while licence plates were removed from six trucks.

Stennett said charges were laid for a variety of infractions including improper tires, failing to conform to safety standards, having an unsecure load, and having no brake light.

He said a couple of loose lug nuts on truck wheels had to be
