## Local ambulance service faces uncertain future

"I would prefer to see the region run it with our paramedics handling the calls and maintaining the level of service that we provide now."

The 35-member Halton Hills Ambulance Service, with paid staff week days and volunteers covering nights at

weekends, is currently funded by the province which owns and ambulances and pays the private service to manage and operate them.

The local service, celebrating its 40th anniversary this year, handled approximately 25,000 calls last year, covering a 455 square

mile area. The service operates out a Georgetown station and staffs an Acton satellite station overnights and on weekends.

"Until someone approaches us we really don't know what's going to happen, so it's business as usual," Raine concluded.

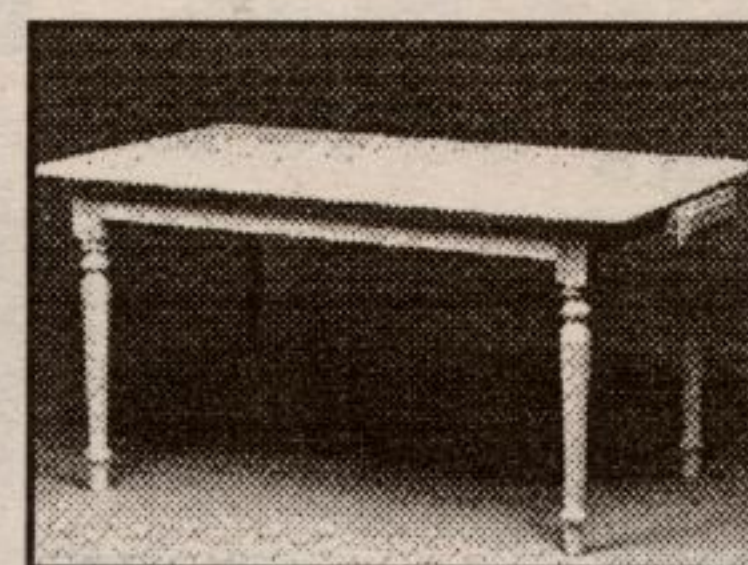
