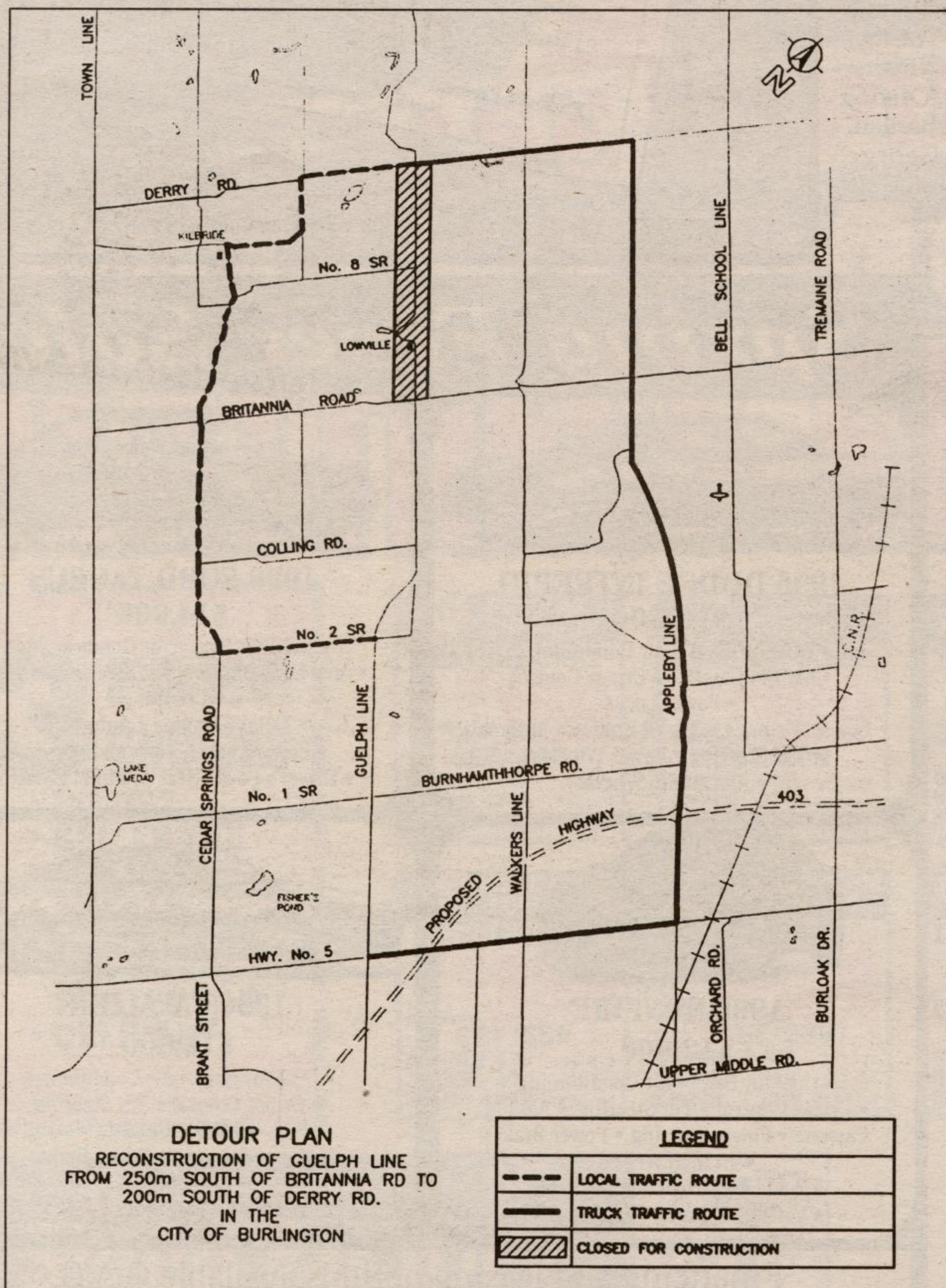

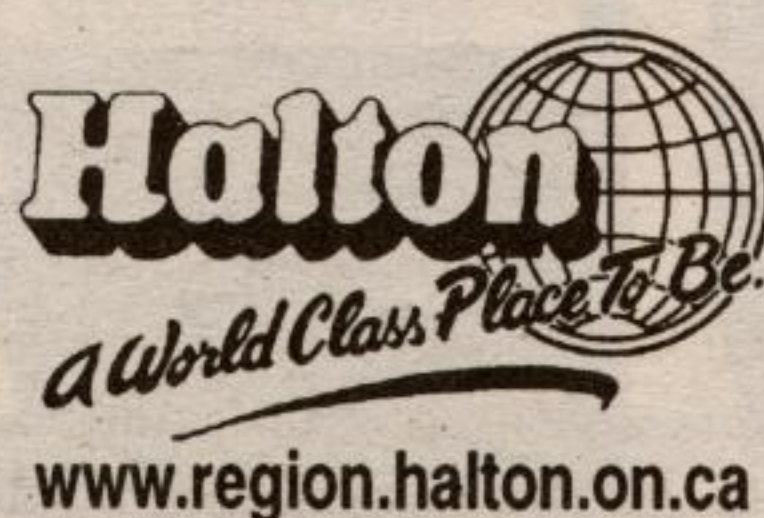
Traffic will be detoured as illustrated below.

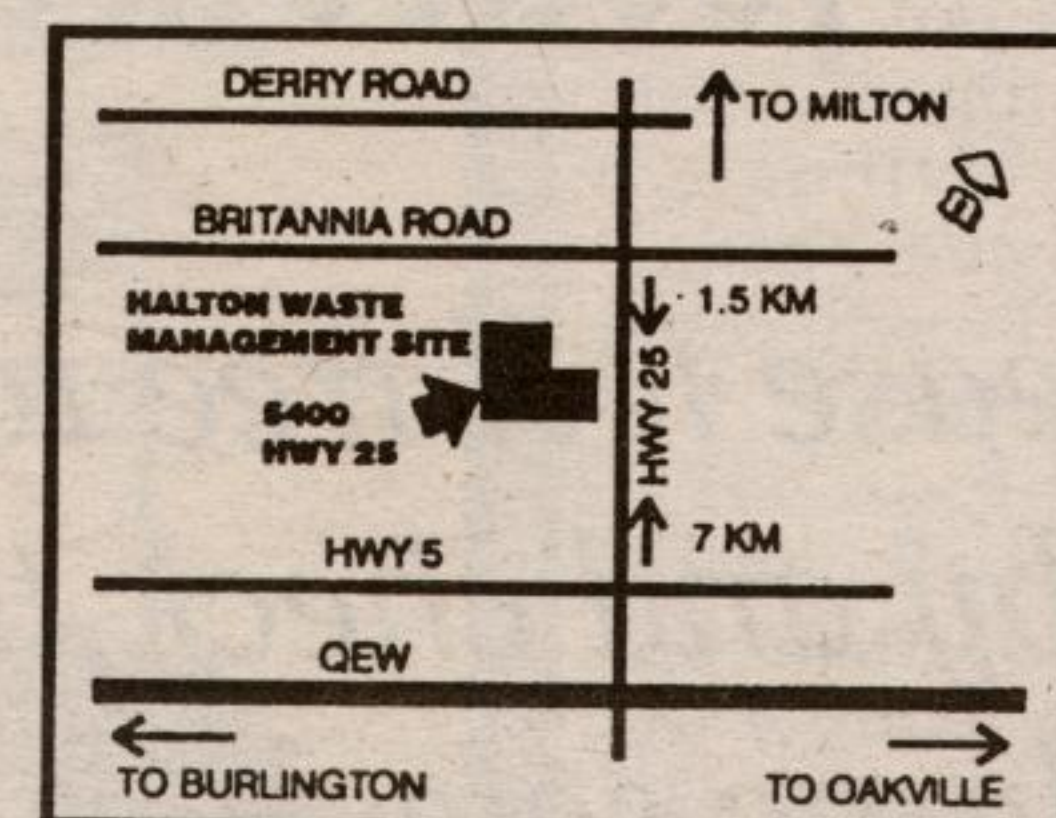
