

Champ to carry Green Party banner

A 25-year-old Stewarttown man will be the Green Party of Canada's Halton riding candidate in the upcoming federal election.

Bill Champ, who joined the party a few months ago and has never run for political office, has agreed to represent the party in the riding.

Champ, who recently graduated from the University of Toronto with a BSc in astronomy and philosophy, works at Solinst Canada Ltd. as a production assistant, and with his father in Champ Consulting Services Inc. He plans to go to law school.

In the election Champ will campaign for government initiatives, including green technology retrofitting programs, which would increase job opportunities for Canadians, proportional representation, the four-day work week and shifting taxes from incomes to resources which he said will make people cheaper to hire as well as reduce pollution.

"The issues of social and environmental justice must be at the forefront in the coming election," said Champ. "True participatory democracy is more than just voting, it is about discussion of alternatives. It is my goal to contribute to that debate."

IN MEMORIAM OF EMMANUEL WILLIAM KARN

KARN, Emmanuel William--of Little Current, Manitoulin Island, Ontario, passed away peacefully February 9, 1997 at Manitoulin Health Centre, at the age of 78.

Emmanuel enlisted in the army, 48th Highlanders, Lorne Scots Regiment in 1939. Through one of his army buddies, he was introduced to Helen Meredith (of Limehouse) whom he married in 1946, after returning from overseas. They made their home in Limehouse and Emmanuel worked at Smith and Stone in Georgetown.

The Karn family band - which included Emmanuel, wife Helen, and brothers Harold and Carl Karn, entertained at many weddings and community dances at the Limehouse Hall during the 40's, 50's and 60's. Many Limehouse and area residents will recall these events.

Emmanuel and wife Helen attended Limehouse Presbyterian Church. They were also members of Georgetown Presbyterian Church choir for 15 years, until they moved to Manitoulin Island in 1969, due to Emmanuel's lung condition.

Emmanuel is survived by his wife Helen, their children Eleanor Smith (husband Merv) of Meaford, Edgar (friend Judy Cull) of Lively, Beth Spear (husband Danny) of Napanee, Larry (wife Deborah) of Mindemoya, Beverley (fiancée Glenn Klages) of Little Current, Judy St. Onge (husband Keith) of McKerrow and god child Donna Karn (nee Geary) of Sudbury. Also survived by 18 grandchildren, one great granddaughter, his brother Harold of Little Current, his sisters Ethel Monroe of Thessalon and Edeleen Agar of Brampton. He was predeceased by his parents Eleanor (nee Ott) and William, brothers Floyd, Alvin, Russell, Carl and sister Vera Burt.

His funeral was held at Little Current United Church on February 14, 1997. Acting as pallbearers were his grandsons Dean Smith, Spencer Smith, Eric Karn, Ryan Karn, Adam karn and Brian Pounder. Honourary pallbearers were Fred Piehl, James Schofield and Marv Brouse. Spring Interment will be at Cold Springs Cemetery on Manitoulin Island.

Community Care Access Centre of Halton

Applications are invited for volunteer board members to fill two (2) vacancies on the Board of Directors of the Community Care Access Centre of Halton.

The Community Care Access Centre is a new approach to providing simplified access to health and support services at home, in Nursing Homes and Homes for the Aged. It combines the services of the former Home Care Program and Placement Co-ordination Services to provide access to a range of long-term care services including nursing, therapy, homemaking and longterm care services facilities. It also provides information about other related community services. The Board is responsible for the overall management of a budget in excess of \$21 million.

Appointments to the Board are made for an initial term of one to three years. Board members typically volunteer fifteen to twenty hours per month to Board and committee business.

Applications are invited from the residents of the Region of Halton who are or have been users of the above services, family caregivers and community members who have work or volunteer experience in health or social services. Volunteers with communications, public relations, legal or financial skills are particularly needed.

To avoid conflict of interest, people directly associated with agencies or organizations that have or hope to have service or supply contracts with the CCAC, and people who operate long-term care facilities, are not eligible to be board members of the CCAC.
