


The Secret Garden blossoms with young talent

TAX TALK A PUBLIC SERVICE OF H&R BLOCK

Q. Last year, I took two one-day courses at a local community college. Each cost \$75. I was told that I cannot claim them because tuition fees must be over \$100. Is this correct?

A. It is true that you cannot claim tuition fees unless they exceed \$100, but this applies to the total fees paid to the same institution, not to each individual fee. Because your total tuition fees add up to \$150, you are allowed to claim them. However, if you paid \$75 to each of two different institutions, you would not be able to do so.
