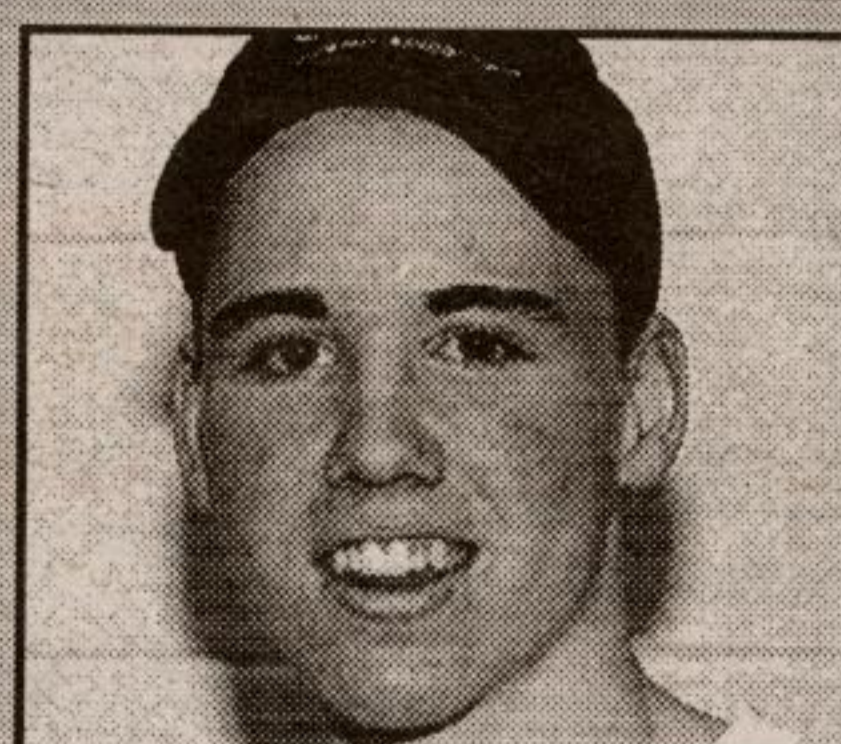

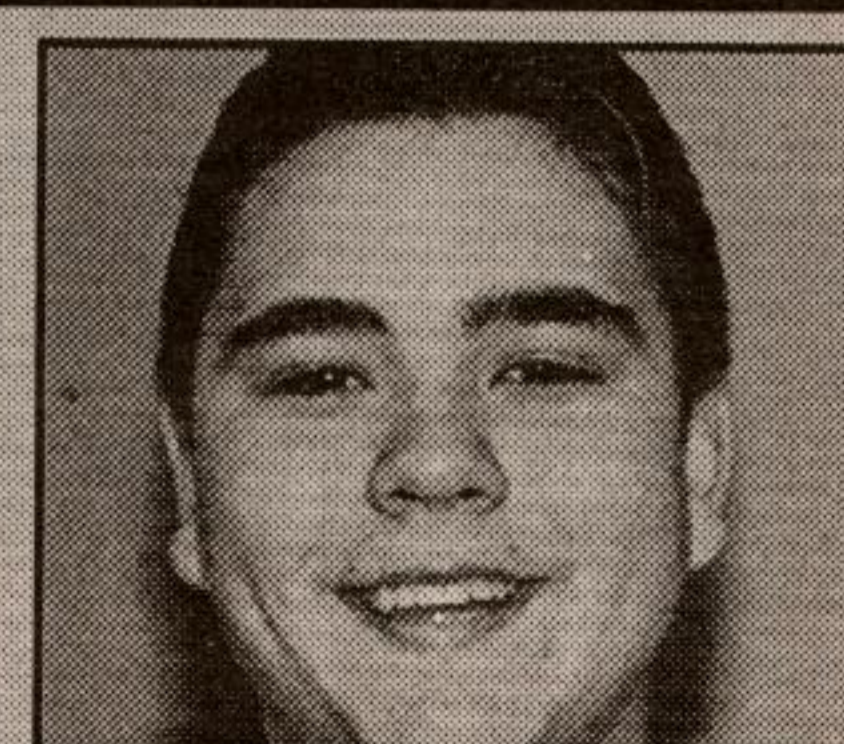
Constant was feted for going 3-0
