The audience cannot help but like both Lisa Sheppard and David Ambrose as they portray brother and sister, Martha and Dickon. Lisa gives us a caring young lady, while David presents us with a near magical fellow, quite at home with nature.

One colorful character is Ken Gorin, cast as Ben Weatherstaff, head gardener of the estate. Gorin doesn't have many lines, but he's always noticed.

Gerri Schaljo takes the part of head school mistress Mrs. Wintrop. Although her part is very small, she endures some pretty strong abuse from little Mary, adding a comic side to the plot.

The tone of the production is somewhat sinister, or at least very dark. Although the book was

originally written as a children's story, this play would not appeal to kids. It is just too moody, covering a gamut of emotions.

The stage is occupied with ghosts, distinguishable by their white outfits, contrasting the mortals in their ordinary clothing. The set is quite colorful, and presents a myriad of different motifs, including some east Indian artwork, some English country manor flavor, and others with a fantasy appeal.

The Secret Garden is not necessarily for everyone. Although it's a poignant story of death and suffering, interspersed with beautiful music, the happy ending seems to justify the suffering.

But, as in real life, that's sometimes how it must be.

The show continues this week.
