MS Carnation Campaign on this weekend

A spring approaches and Mother's Day nears that can only mean one thing—the Multiple Sclerosis Society of Canada's annual Carnation Campaign.

The MS Society Carnation Campaign, implemented across Canada, is a fund-raising event held annually each May.

On May 8, 9, and 10, volunteers all across the province will be offering carnations to the public in return for donations that support vital MS research and client services.

"I encourage everyone to take

notice and support the Multiple Sclerosis Society by purchasing a carnation for that special person in their life. It could be the most important flower they will ever receive since donations help fund vital research and services for people living with MS," said Wendy Gibbs, vice-president of fund-raising for the MS Society.

MS research has begun to yield results that are now being used to treat people who have MS. In 1995, the Canadian government approved one type of beta interferon for relapsing-remitting MS that has been shown to reduce the frequency and severity of MS attacks.

Multiple Sclerosis attacks the central nervous system of people in the prime of their life causing varied symptoms including numbness, loss of balance, extreme fatigue, and possible paralysis.

Its cause is unknown, its cure undiscovered and its course unpredictable. Tens of thousands of Canadians have the disease, which as yet has no known cause or cure.

The MS Society of Canada expects to raise \$2 million nationwide from the Carnation Campaign this year. Since its inception in 1976, the event has raised \$27 million for the Multiple Sclerosis Society of Canada.




