# Bulldogs nip Nepean Knights

With a struggling opponent coming to town, the Georgetown Bulldogs shouldn't have any trouble chalking up a win. The problem was they knew that.

The Bulldogs barely did what was necessary to pull out a 6-3 victory over the visiting Nepean Knights. The Knights came into the game having been outscored 49-11 in their first two games, including a 28-2 thrashing by Elora, but you wouldn't have known it from watching Sunday's Ontario Lacrosse Association Jr. B game. In fact, had it not been for goalie Brandon Miller, the Bulldogs could have been walking out with their tail between their legs.

"Brandon was our first star," said Georgetown coach Ken Webster. "(Nepean) deserved to beat us. They outplayed us."

Miller kept the Knights from pulling away in the early part of the game when they outchanced Georgetown by far. The 17-year-old took over the number one job after serving as the Bulldogs backup last season and has improved with each game.

Another player benefitting from more floor time is Brad Kouyoumjian. With the score 2-1, he scored a pair of power-play goals in the second period that gave Georgetown some breathing room. He then set up Adam Lorentz as the lead was extended to 5-1. The second-year Bulldog said Nepean's poor showings may have made the team overconfident.

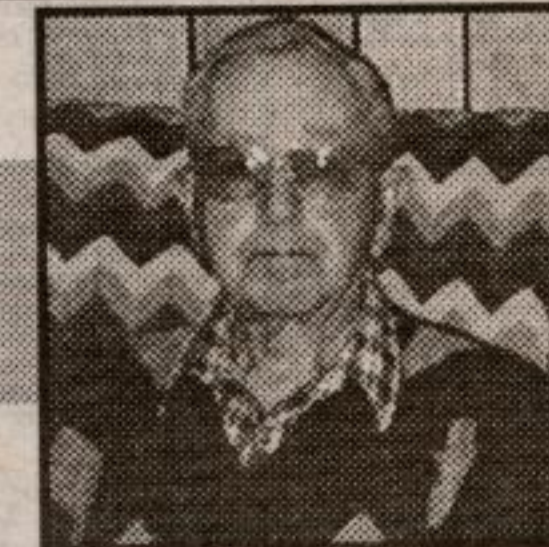
