Town okays new dog licensing program

A new dog licensing program being introduced by Halton Hills council should save the town about \$40,000 this year and ensure many more dogs are licensed and vaccinated annually for rabies.

At the general committee meeting Monday night, Halton Hills council members gave the go-ahead to the program on a one-year trial basis.

The town's current program has not been that successful. A staff report states only 2,396 of the esti-

mated 8,259 dogs in the town are licensed. The current dog licensing and canine control program costs taxpayers about \$65,000 a year. Under the new program it's estimated the cost of the program this year will be only \$12,520 and in future years about \$7,195.

The first step will be to do a dog census which will get underway this summer.

Three students will knock on all doors in the town to get an accurate count on the number of dogs, and hand out information packets to dog owners, which will likely include a licence application and information about licensing and rabies vaccinations.

The dog census will provide the town with an accurate record of who owns a dog, and who hasn't bought a licence.

Enforcement is a key aspect of the success of the program. Dog owners who insist on not licensing their dogs will be fined, up to a maximum of \$5,000 if it goes to court, or \$100 if it is settled through an out-of-court payment.

"Nothing would please us more if everyone came in and got their licence," said Bob Ustrzycki, the town's law enforcement and licensing officer.

Under the new program dog licences will be available through veterinarian offices and the Civic Centre. At a cost of \$20 annually dog owners will renew licences on the anniversary date of purchase. There will be no licence fee for seeing eye dogs and seniors will only pay \$10.

Dog owners will retain the original serial number and tag for the life of their dog.

Dog owners will not be able to renew their licences unless their dog has had its annual rabies shot.

Instead of dog tags, dog owners will have the option of having a micro-chip implanted in their dog for permanent identification. Those who opt for micro-chip implantation will have to pay their vet for the procedure, less than \$60, plus a one-time licence fee of \$40.


