## Memories of a grand old building

arly last week, we were all saddened with the loss of Georgetown Little Theatre Studio in Stewarttown when it burned to the ground.

I'm sure everyone who has ever driven north on Trafalgar Road has seen that unique building beside the river in Stewarttown, and enjoyed the sight it provided for more than a century and a half. Its loss will certainly be felt by members of Georgetown Little Theatre (GLT), and all its patrons.

But it goes a lot deeper for me.

You see, that building has been a part of my life, off and on, as I've grown over the years, and seeing the pile of smoking rubble brought back some of those memories.

Of course, since GLT acquired the structure in 1985, I've attended numerous GLT rehearsals, dinners and celebrations at that wonderful old building over the years.


But when I was a child, that building was the Esquesing Township office, the meeting place for township council until its replacement was built on Trafalgar Road, north of Maple Avenue in the early 60s. (For those who don't know, Esquesing Township was the rural area between Acton and Georgetown before regional government was introduced in 1974 which resulted in the formation of the Town of Halton Hills.)

The township works yard was originally located there, and two township graders were stored in the garage at the back of the building.

Stewarttown Hall was also the hub of the township, used as a community hall for social events and a polling station during elections.

I remember sitting at the head table at my sister's wedding reception in July of 1969 in that hall, as I toasted the bridesmaids, and made my sister cry when I told her now nice she looked on her wedding day.

I thought back of attending the golden wedding anniversary celebration of my great aunt and uncle, Agnes and Harry Brown, along with my many cousins in that hall.



My Aunt Marjorie and Uncle Lloyd Fisher celebrated their silver wedding anniversary there as well, as the hall was filled with my many aunts, uncles and cousins.

My wife shares as many memories.

Stewarttown School regularly used the hall for its Christmas concerts, so she has fond memories of Christmases from her past.

Besides, her grandfather, K.C. Lindsay, was clerk of the township for a lifetime, so Cathy often walked down the hill from school to wait patiently for her grandfather to finish work so she could hitch a ride home.

As a kid, I remembered visiting the building with my dad, and watching old K.C. lean back in his chair, smoke curling from his pipe while he worked with township assessor Art Benton and secretary Cathy Bouskill as they went about their day-to-day duties of seeing to the business of the township.

In those days, our church minute books were stored in the vault at the hall for safekeeping.

Standing, looking at the blackened shell of the vault jutting out from the rubble Tuesday morning, it occurred to me how even during its final moments, that same vault provided protection for GLT's archives as fire ravaged the building.

Although the backhoe has since flattened the bricks, and the smoke has stopped curling from the rubble, one thing remains—memories of a grand old building that served its community so very well, for so very long.




