Funds will be raised from pledge sheets and other activities at the event. Although pledge sheets are not necessary

The Acton Kinsmen and Kinettes will offer their support and help at the event. The Kinsmen and Kinette Clubs across Canada have supported CF since 1965, and as a national project since 1986.

Come out and enjoy a day with Zellers. There will be prizes for the youngest and oldest skaters, as well as for the most pledges.

With your support and participation, Zellers hopes to raise the funds necessary to help find a

cure for cystic fibrosis. You can help make the difference. Since the very first Moonwalk for CF took place in 1985, Zellers employees and other participants have raised over \$11.8 million for CF research, and they are proud of their efforts.

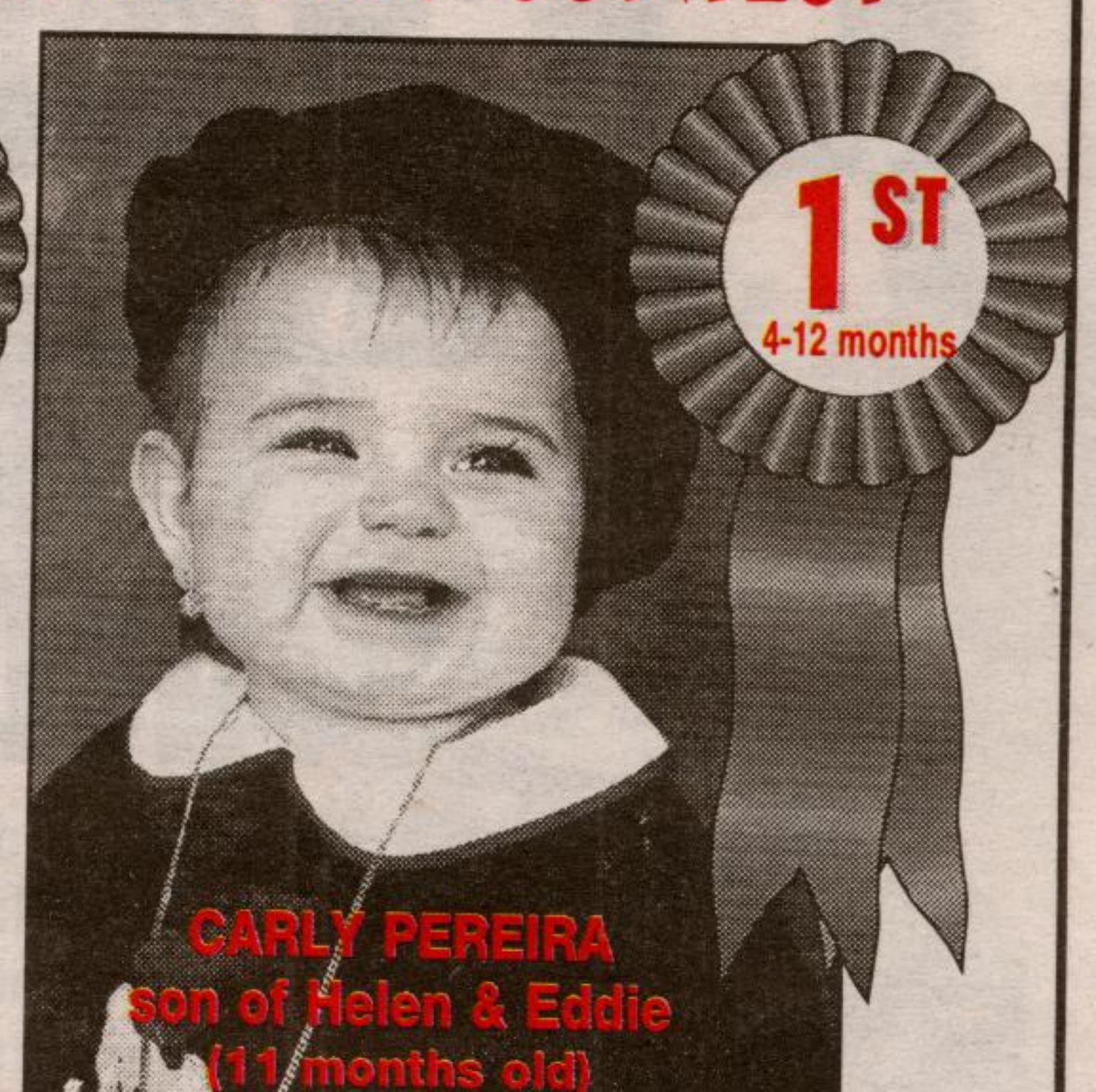

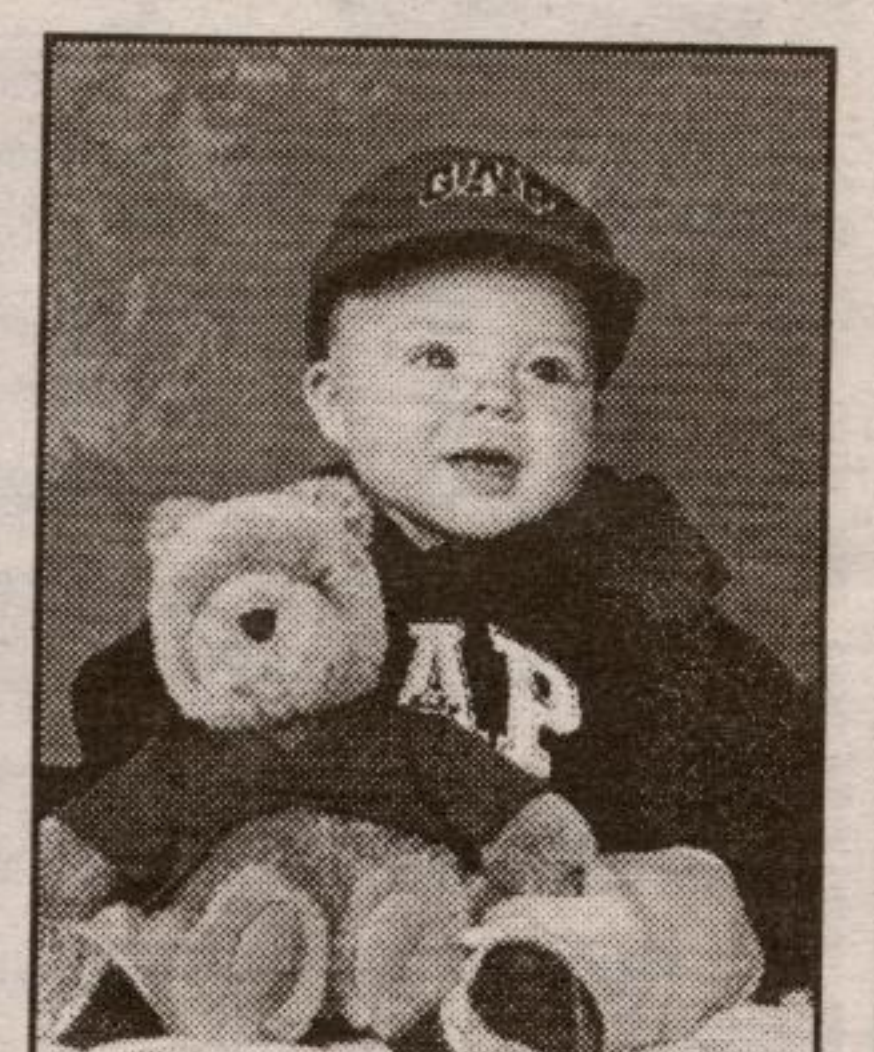
