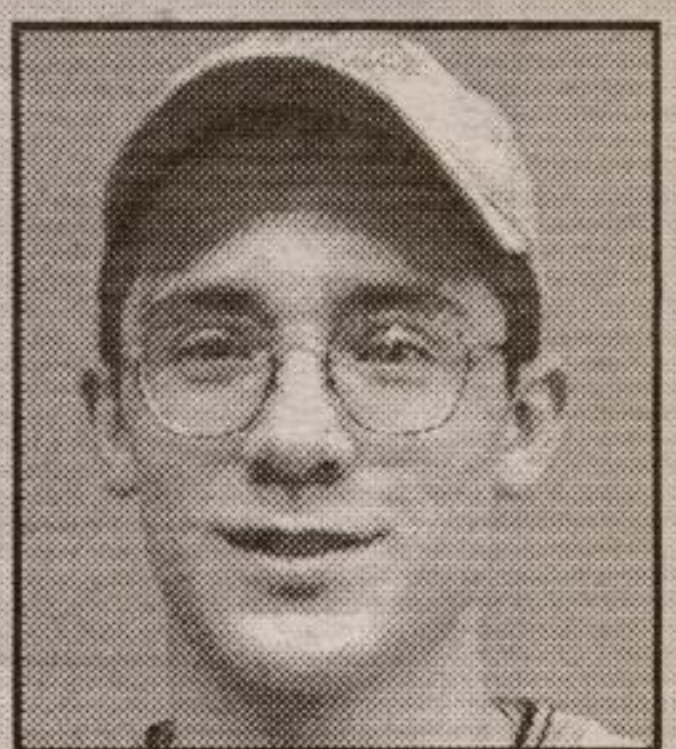

Young was chosen for her outstanding play all season at power on the junior Redmen girls' volleyball team.

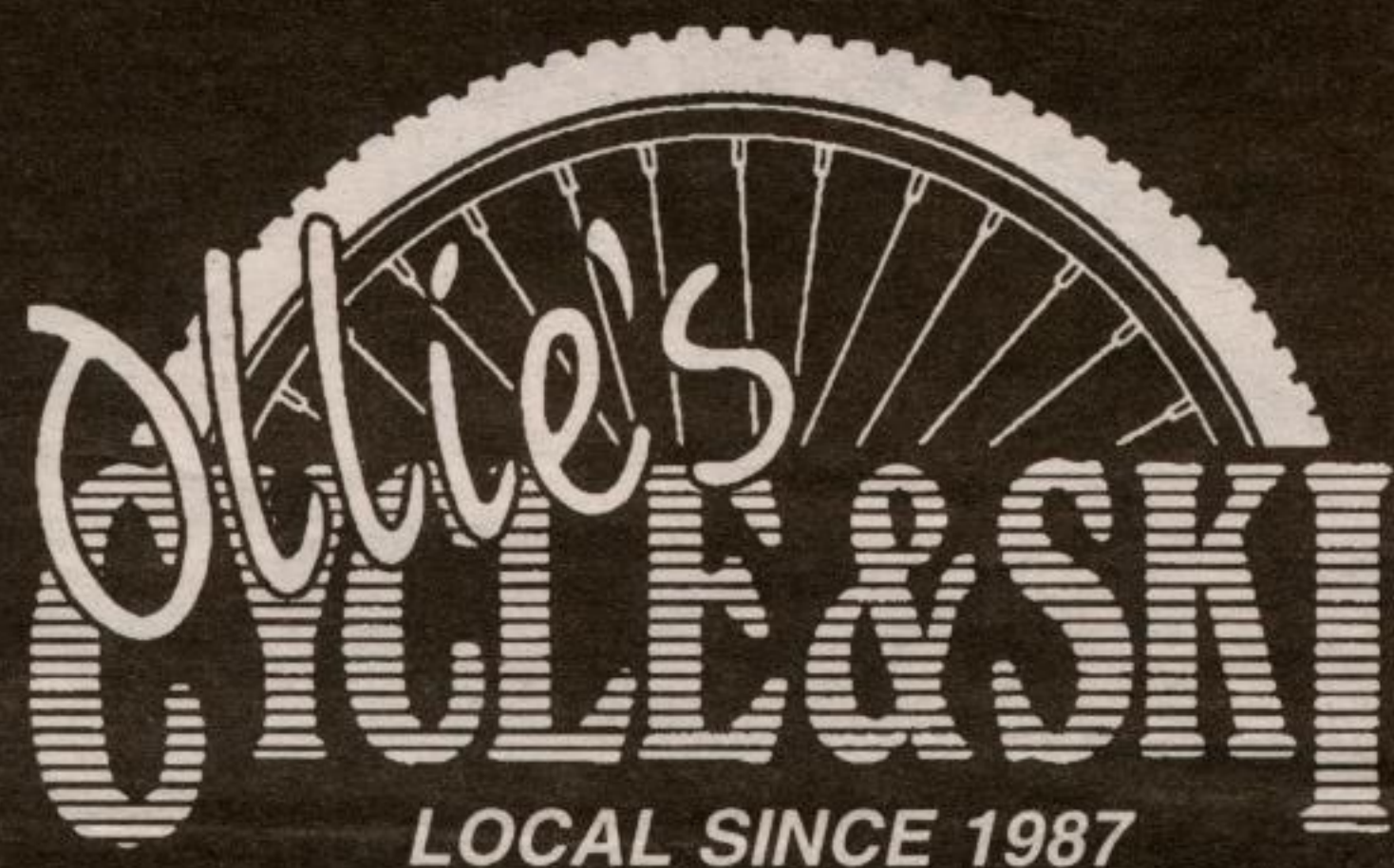
Fraser was chosen for his third place finish in the senior

Week are Lauren Fyfe and Mat Edwards.

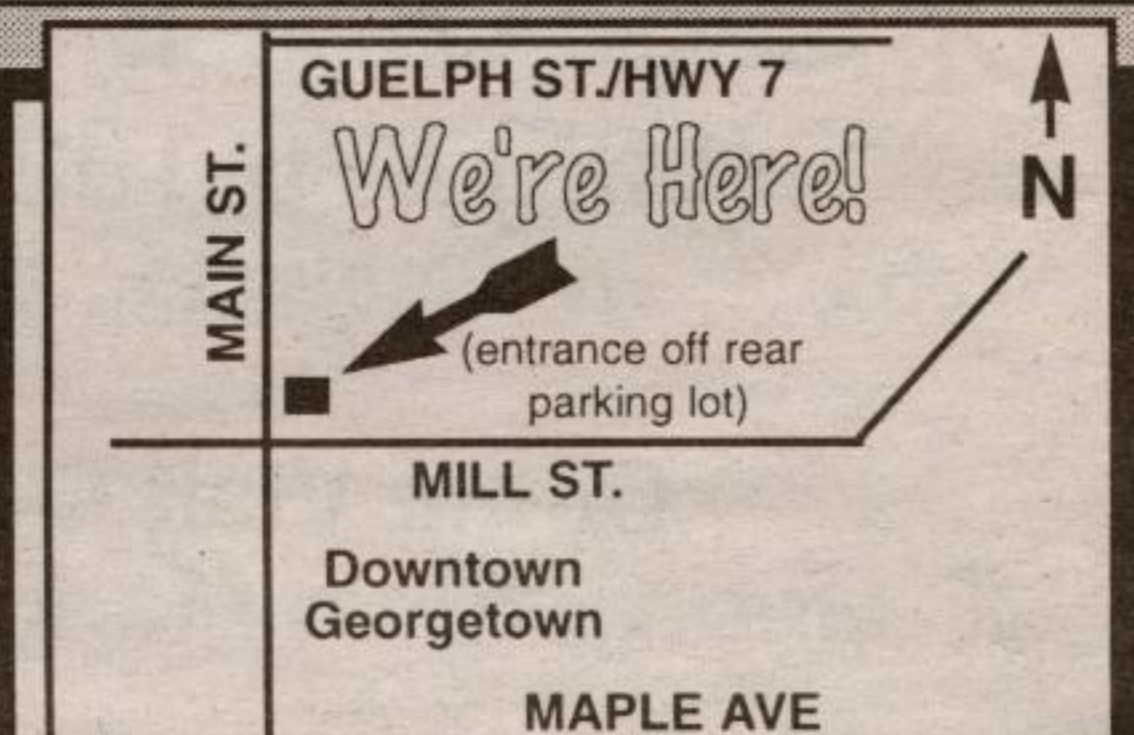
Both athletes were chosen for their aggressive play and strong performance on the Rebels' badminton team in the same recent tournament at Georgetown District High School.
