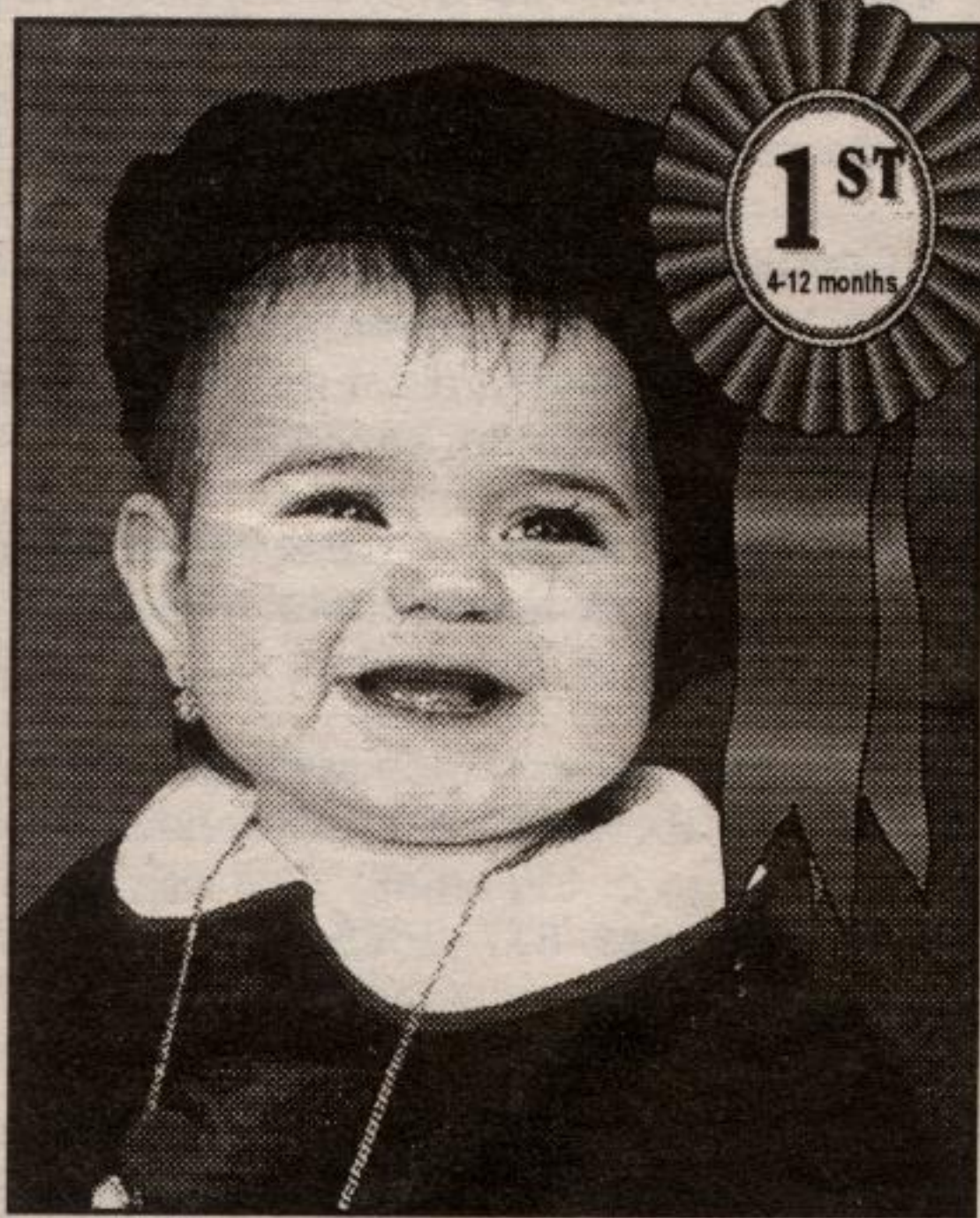

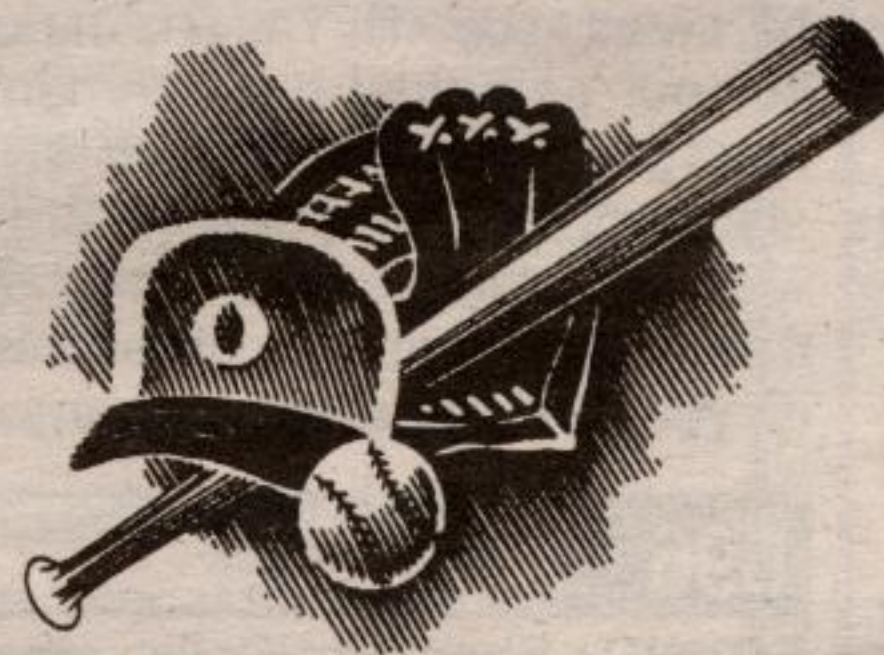

TEAC to host gardeners' seminar

Attention gardeners!
The Town of Halton
Hills Environmental
Advisory Committee (TEAC)
is presenting a landscape nat-
uralization seminar for resi-
dents of Halton Hills, called
Bringing Nature into Your
Backyard.

Whether you are interested
in undertaking a large scale
naturalization project, or just
want information about how
to bring nature into your own
backyard, this seminar is for
you! Learn from local experts
about how to employ natural
approaches to enhance your
surroundings and at the same
time promote a healthier envi-

ronment.
The seminar will cover
such topics as: water garden-
ing and ponds, using native
plant species in your gardens,
wetland rehabilitation, and
the town's newest park,
Willow Park Ecology Centre.

The seminar is to be held

Norval. It will run from 9 a.m.

tralia and New Zealand.

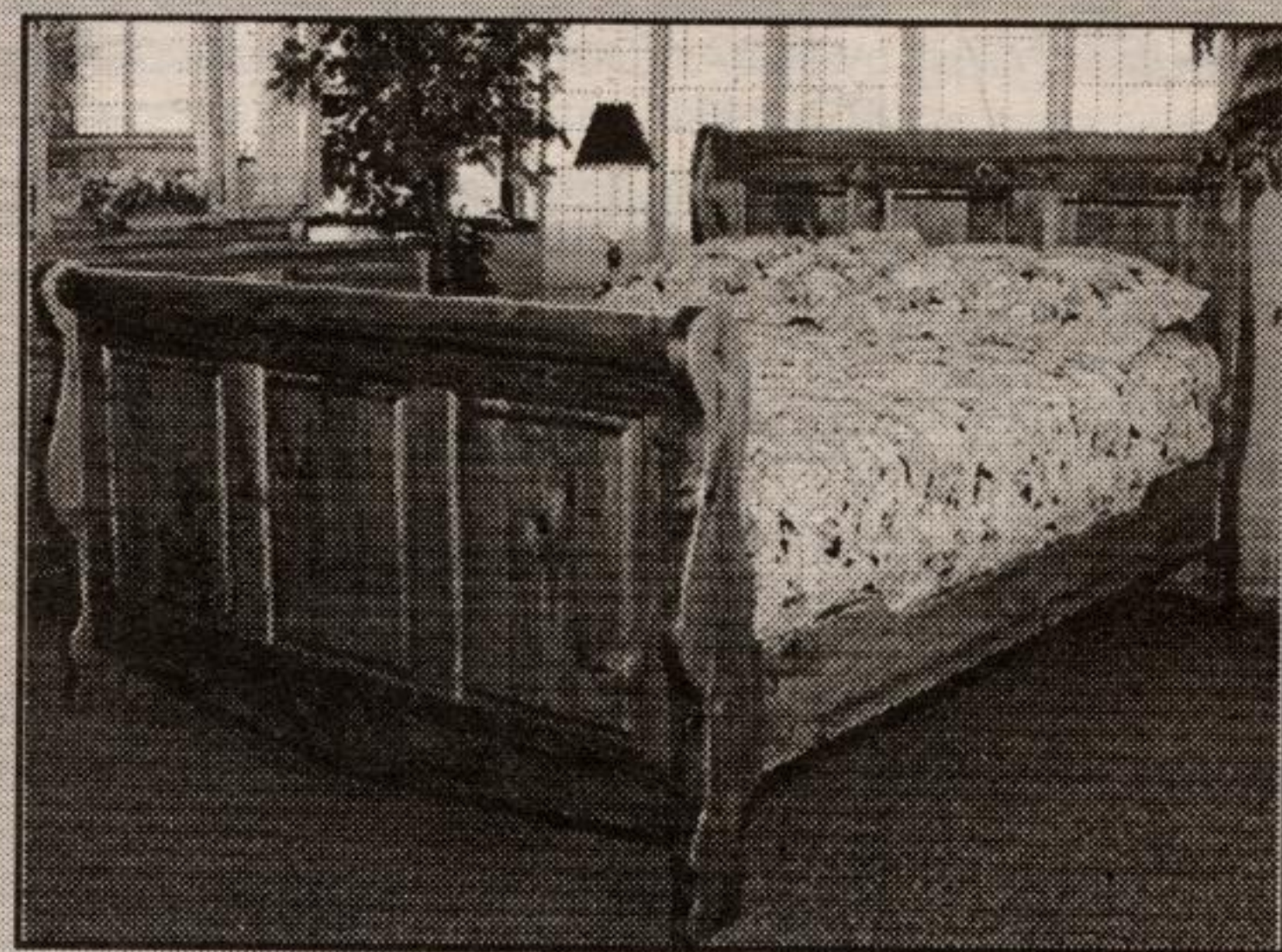
Hansen says the Acton area

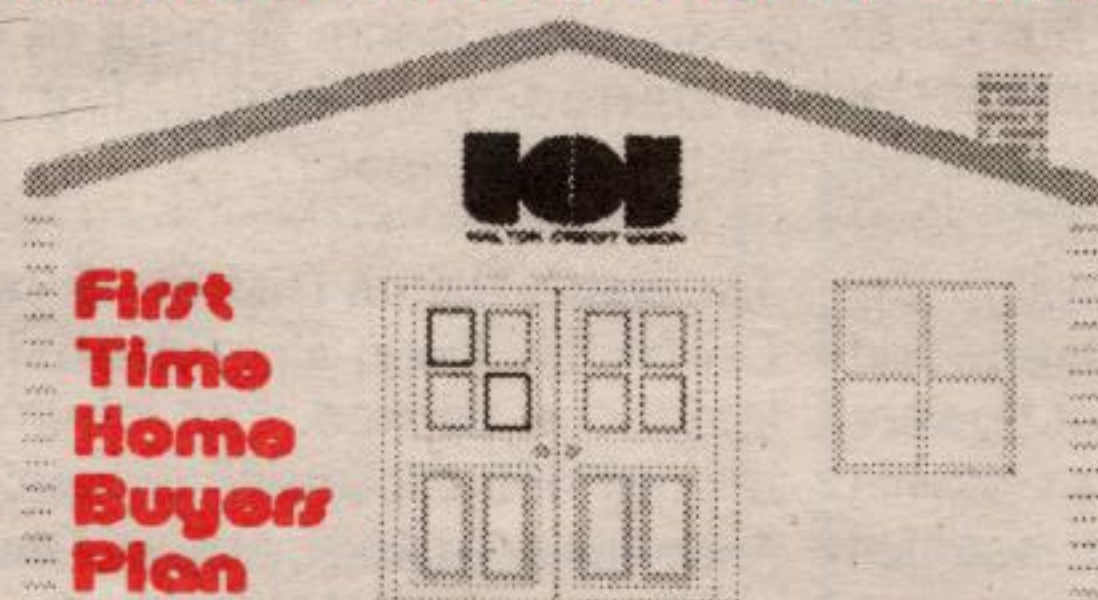
