More than 230 items will be on the auction block tomorrow in the 14th Annual Kinsmen TV Auction.

The auction, which has raised more than \$100,000 for Kinsmen community projects and children's sports teams since its inception, will be televised on Halton Cable 14 from 6 p.m. through 10:30 p.m.

Items up for auction in the event put on by the Kinsmen Club of Georgetown have been donated by local businesses. On the block will be a six-person hot tub valued at \$4,830 from Emerald Isle Bedroom Gallery, a \$2,313 Carrier air conditioner from Select Energy, a Sebring convertible for the month of July valued at \$1,800 from Georgetown Chrysler Jeep, a Class Act central vacuum system from Living Lighting valued at \$1,350, a 13cubic feet freezer and \$200 in frozen food from Brian's Food Basics valued at \$500 and many others.

Bids can be placed during the auction by calling 853-5273. Kinsmen Club of Georgetown members and other volunteers will man the 12 lines throughout the evening.

Kinsmen Club of Georgetown president John Duncan said area schools will be partners in each segment, so a portion of money raised during specific time periods will go to the partnering school or schools.
