

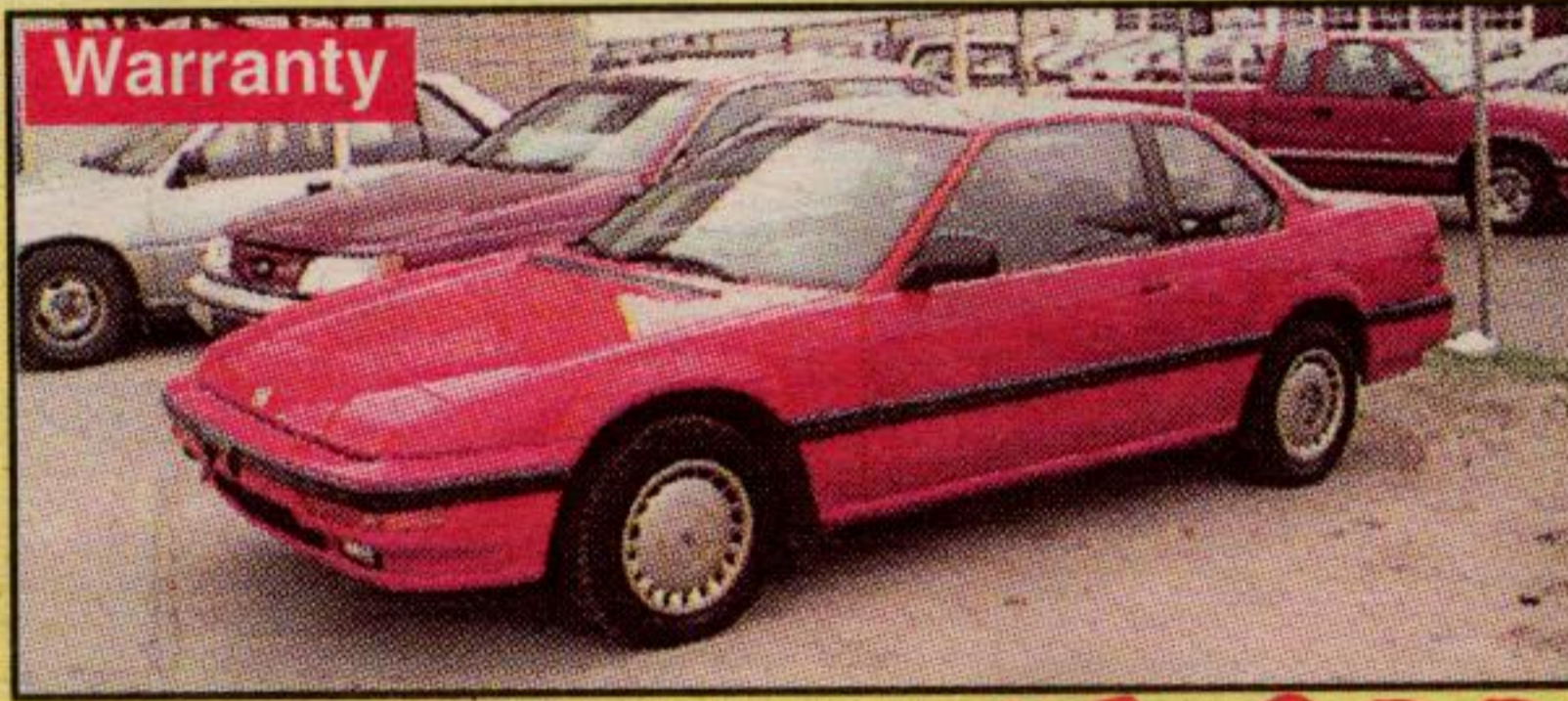

Medical boss calls stats a 'bit of an issue' here

The results were included in a report from Nosal for the region's Health and Social Services Committee. He said the higher number in Halton Hills was not "statistically significant" but it was a "bit of an issue."

The region sampled for a bacteria which indicates the food may not have been kept at the correct temperature, coliform which revealed there may have been cross-contamination while preparing the food, for example a knife used to cut raw chicken could have been used to cut vegetables for a salad, and E. Coli which indicates the presence of fecal material, likely due to poor hand washing. A similar sampling was done in 1991.

Nosal said the sampling done in 1997 showed that 28 per cent of the samples analyzed region-wide showed temperature abuse, compared to 54 per cent in 1991. Coliform was found in 29 per cent of the samples last year and 31 per cent in 1991. The samples that contained E. Coli remained at about 11 per cent in 1997 and 1991.

"There has been a dramatic improvement in the indicators for temperature abuse," said Nosal.

He said the E. Coli is the more worrisome organism, because it has more of a potential to cause illness.

"Clearly I would like that number to be approaching zero."

Nosal said of the items sampled salads had the most bacteria. Of the 33 salad samples analyzed 57 per cent of them showed they weren't stored at the right temperature, 63 per cent had more than the provincial standard for coliform and 24 per cent showed levels of E. Coli.

Nosal could not compare Halton's results with other areas because he said he didn't know of any other health departments that had done a similar sampling.

He said in Halton two-thirds of food-related illnesses are attributed to eating at home and foreign travel.
