OVERSEEDING

Overseeding means sewing grass seed over a lawn where some grass is already established. Dead patches left from winter, disease or insect damage. When overseeding, rake the area well, seed as evenly as you can, then stamp the seed into contact with the soil. The newly-seeded area must be kept moist by watering it frequently. Homeowners are sometimes disappointed with the initial results from overseeding. Overseeded areas take approximately one whole month to become established and people easily get frustrated. Overseeding can help to improve a problem area, so be patient and keep watering!
