Investigation over: Branch 120 Legion back to business

ranch 120 had been operating under somewhat of a cloud over the summer months as a Provincial Command Board of Management took over the day-to-day operations of the branch. That cloud has now been dispersed following this statement released by Board of Management chairman, Bill Sheilds.

"The Board of Management appointed by Provincial Command has concluded its review and investigation. The Board did not find any evidence of criminal wrongdoing on the part of members of the executive in office at the time of the Board assuming the responsibilities of the affairs of the branch. Neither did it find any attempt to purposely mislead the members of the branch or the Board.

Elections have been concluded for the 1998-99 term of office and all members properly installed in office. Therefore the Board has recommended to Command that the branch executive assume their full duties and responsibilities effective Sept. 14, 1998.

The Board of Management would like to thank those who remained in their various chairs and greatly assisted us during our time here. Without their co-operation, we would not have been able to complete our work as early as we have."

At the last general meeting, \$900 in donations was approved; funds going to the Organization for the Prevention of Skin Disorders and the Halton Hills Literacy Guild. It was also approved that Branch 120 sponsor three teams in the Halton Dart League.

The Honours, Awards and Initiation ceremonies are scheduled for Oct. 23, 8 p.m. in the upstairs hall. Those to be initiated are requested to report to the branch by 7:30 p.m.

The Branch 120 dues structure has changed. Effective immediately, dues for ordinary, associate and fraternal members will be \$40. The Early Bird has been eliminated, but 10 members who pay their dues by Nov. 30, in a special draw, will have their money refunded.

The annual Branch 120-sponsored elementary schools cross-country meet, scheduled for Sept. 24 at Cedarvale Park, will go as planned. Volunteer course marshals are required, in uniform, and should report to the Cedarvale Park main parking lot at 3:30 p.m. A sign-up sheet has been posted in the canteen.
