Driver charged after friend dies in crash

A morning has left a Georgetown man dead and another Georgetown man charged with impaired driving causing death.

Killed instantly in the single-vehicle accident that occurred on the Sixth Line E. south of Britannia Rd. was Christopher Wilson, 35, of Lauchlin Cres.

Halton Police say at about 3 a.m. a Ford Explorer, driven northbound on the Sixth Line by Christopher Garrett, 37, of Donaghedy Dr. came upon a curve south of Britannia Rd., went out of control, left the roadway and rolled over. Wilson, who was in the front

passenger seat, was ejected.

Another Georgetown man, whose name wasn't released by police, was in the back seat and wasn't injured. Garrett was taken to Milton District Hospital with minor injuries.

Garrett, who Wilson had known for a few years, has been charged with impaired driving causing death,

criminal negligence causing death, and having over 80 mg of alcohol in 100 ml of blood. He is

to be in Milton court on October 19.

Wilson is survived by his wife Carol, daughters Ashleigh and Sydney, his mother Marlene Wilson, grandmother Dorothy Coffey, and brother Mark and his wife Fiona.

Alan Dean, Wilson's father-in-law, said his son-in-law had been at a golf tournament at Indian Wells Golf Course in Burlington Friday afternoon with friends he played hockey with. They attended a banquet at a Burlington restaurant after the tournament. He had spoken to his wife from the course on his cellular phone.
