Local teachers to continue job action despite back to work legislation

Back to work legislation won't prevent withdrawal of voluntary services or rotating strikes, says a representative for Halton's public secondary teachers.

Al Tanner, president of the Ontario Secondary Schools Teachers' Federation (Halton) said he believes his members can still take both these job actions.

"The legislation won't affect us at all," said Al Tanner. "As far as I understand, it only affects boards in a full withdrawal situation."

The Back to School Act was passed by the provincial legislature late Monday evening.

It ordered classes to resume at eight Ontario school boards where full-scale strikes or walkouts were in progress.

Tanner said the legislation establishes rules under which classes will resume at these boards. Durham is the only public school board affected, as the remainder are Catholic school boards.

The Halton board's director of labour relations agreed Halton teachers can still withdraw voluntary services and participate in rotating strikes.

"We're not covered under that," said Dawn Beckett-Morton.

Tanner expects Halton public secondary teachers will continue to withdraw voluntary services.

This means after-school activities such as academic help, sports,

arts programs and clubs will continue to be curtailed.

The teachers are boycotting extra-curricular activities, in part because of increased workloads. Halton's public secondary teachers are currently handling seven classes per year instead of six.

Tanner also feels teachers can still participate in rotating one-day walkouts.

Secondary teachers at 20 of Ontario's 31 public school boards, including this region, have threatened to participate in the strikes.

So far, Halton has not been chosen for a one-day strike. Teachers have promised to provide 24 hours' notice of a walkout.

Halton's elementary teachers have also been advised to refuse coaching and supervisory duties for after-school activities.

The next dates for mediation talks are Oct. 5 for Halton's public secondary teachers and Oct. 8 for public elementary teachers.

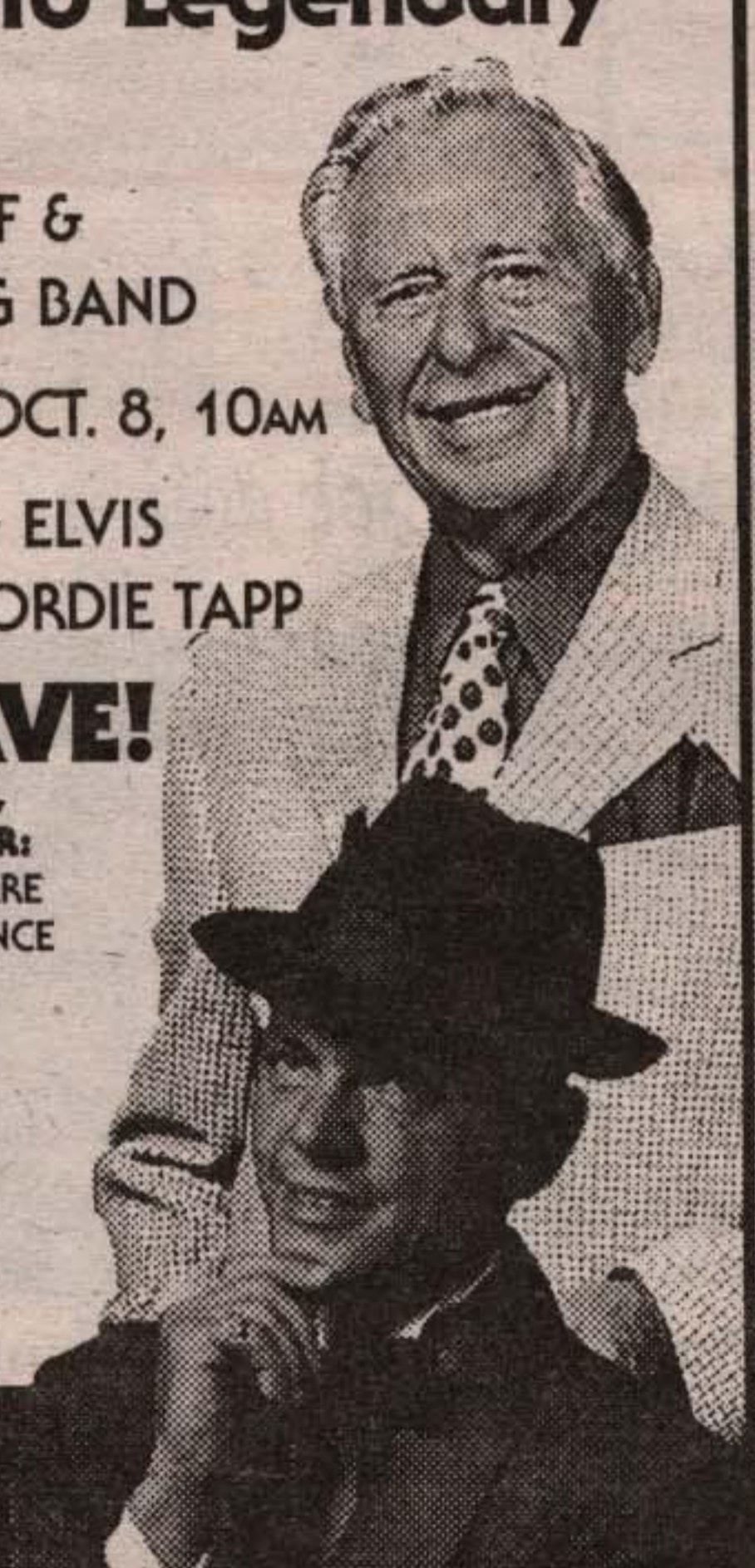

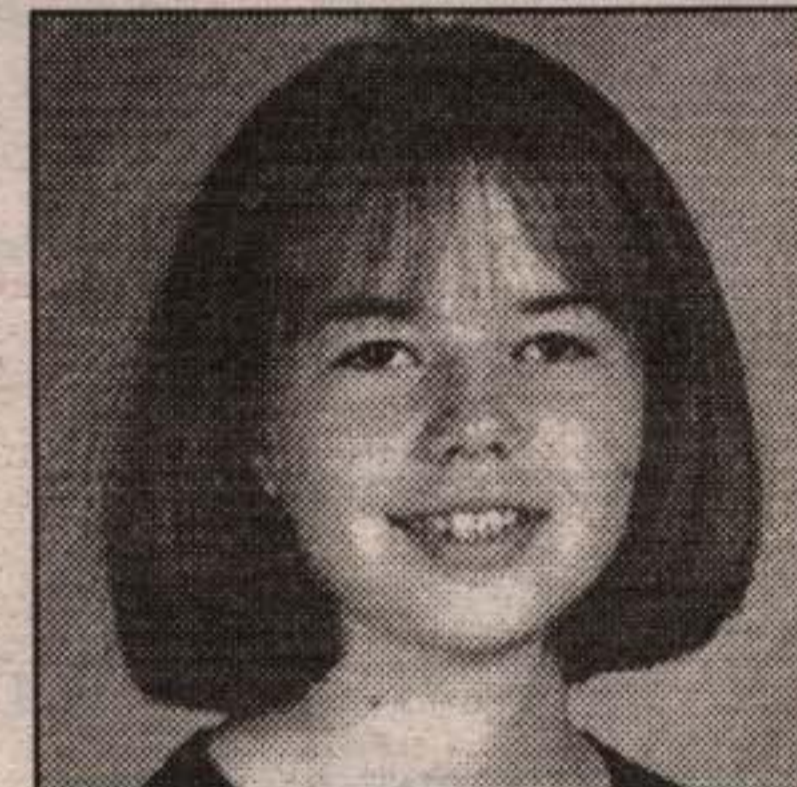
