### WATER AND WASTEWATER SERVICING MASTER PLAN REVIEW

#### REVISED NOTICE OF COMPLETION/ADDENDUM

The Halton Urban Structure Plan set out a process to provide servicing infrastructure for the Region of Halton's response to pressures for new urban growth. The Water and Wastewater Servicing Master Plan was prepared under the Environmental Assessment Act and analyzed alternative approaches and recommended a preferred method of providing water supply and wastewater treatment for the new urban areas proposed in the Halton Urban Structure Plan. Projects listed in the Water and Wastewater Servicing Master Plan were planned in accordance with the **Class Environmental Assessment for Municipal Water and Wastewater Projects**.

At the direction of Regional Council, a review of the Master Plan was undertaken to identify a recommended servicing implementation plan for the first phase of development in Milton and Halton Hills (6,200 new homes and 300 hectares of employment lands). In accordance with the commitments set out in the Master Plan, the Region has completed a Master Plan Review. This Review resulted in revisions to projects listed in the Master Plan. This Notice is to provide further information to the public on the proposed revisions and to receive input and comment from interested persons. The proposed revisions to the Water and Wastewater Servicing Plan are as follows:

- relocation of the proposed wastewater main from Sixteen Mile Creek alignment to Regional Road #25
- deferral of construction of a New Zone 5 reservoir to use the existing Milton reservoir
- introduction of a blended water supply system in Milton (including lake and groundwater)
- deferral of the construction of a new Water Purification Plant in Oakville
- revision to the wastewater servicing concept to include both forcemain and gravity sections along Regional Road #25
- revisions to site specific projects to service the first stage of development in the East-Southeast Phasing Option in Milton Centred area and Halton Hills Highway 401 frontage

These revisions are to provide a cost effective servicing strategy for urban expansion areas entirely within Halton Region in a timely manner with least environmental impact and community disruption.

Interested persons should provide written comment to the Region of Halton on the proposed revisions to the Master Plan within 30 calendar days from the date of this Notice. If concerns regarding a project cannot be resolved in discussion with the Region of Halton a person may request that the Minister of Environment "bump-up" the project to an individual environmental assessment. "Bump-up" requests must be received by the Minister at the address below by October 27, 1998. A copy of the "bump-up" request shall be sent to the Regional Clerk. If there is no "bump-up" request received by October 27, 1998, the Region of Halton will proceed to construct the projects as outlined in the Master Plan Review (Addendum to the Water and Wastewater Servicing Master Plan).
