## Trustees okay funds to rehire teaching assistants

Nome of the special education Instructional Assistant (IA) positions lost earlier this year through budget trimming have been reclaimed by the Halton District School Board.

After some debate and whittling down of the final figure, trustees unanimously approved the overspending of \$300,000 from the 1998-99 school year budget. This allow the board to bring some special education helpers back to the classrooms until at least the end of December.

Brenda Kearney, board superintendent of education for student services, had asked trustees to approve \$900,000 in IA funding for the entire school year, based on a verbal assurance by the Ministry of Education of the same amount in extra money coming to Halton.

But a jittery board, wanting the pledged government dollars in writing, voted in favor of a scaled back budget over-expenditure as an interim measure, until the extra money is confirmed.

The Halton public board had a special education budget of \$33 million last year which paid for 427 full-time equivalent IAs.

In 1998-99 the board, even with the \$900,000, will have a budget, including transportation, of just \$27 million. That money provides 279 IAs, 177 in elementary and 102 in secondary.


The new total includes the recent addition of eight IAs allocated for what is considered unsafe conditions regarding the feeding, lifting and toiletry needs of some special educa-

Should the full \$900,000 in added funding come from the province as promised, 19 IAs will be added to the mix for the current school year, which would still leave the board 125 IAs short of last year's complement.

As of March of this year, the Halton public board had 3,736 students officially recognized as being in need of individual attention and another 1,662 also receiving some level of IA

Instructional assistants do a variety of specific tasks in a one-on-one or cluster group setting in a regular classroom setting. They deal with children identified as being gifted, having an intellectual or physical disability, autism, behavioral challenges or visual, learning, hearing or speech impairments.






