

Last-minute marker sinks Mustangs 2-1

The Georgetown Mustangs were denied a second consecutive championship when North Mississauga's Wendy Hand scored in the last minute of the South Region Soccer League's Elite Division final.

The goal gave North Mississauga a 2-1 win over the Mustangs, who won the Premier Division championship last season. It was the second time this season North Mississauga had scored in the final minute to steal a victory from Georgetown.

Hand had scored the game's first goal from a goal-mouth scramble in the opening minutes of the game. It remained that way until the game's 75th minute when Lindsay Drysdale's shot hit the crossbar. Laura Shields got the rebound and lobbed it over the Mississauga keeper to tie the game.

Jaqui Bajic made some great runs in the second half but the Mustangs couldn't capitalize. At the other end Mustangs' keeper Heather Stephens turned in one of her best games of the season, making a string of saves to keep the game deadlocked. Alanna Zelek also helped out with some great defensive play.

The game remained tied until the final minute when Hand headed a ball in off the crossbar for the winning goal to clinch the Elite Division title.

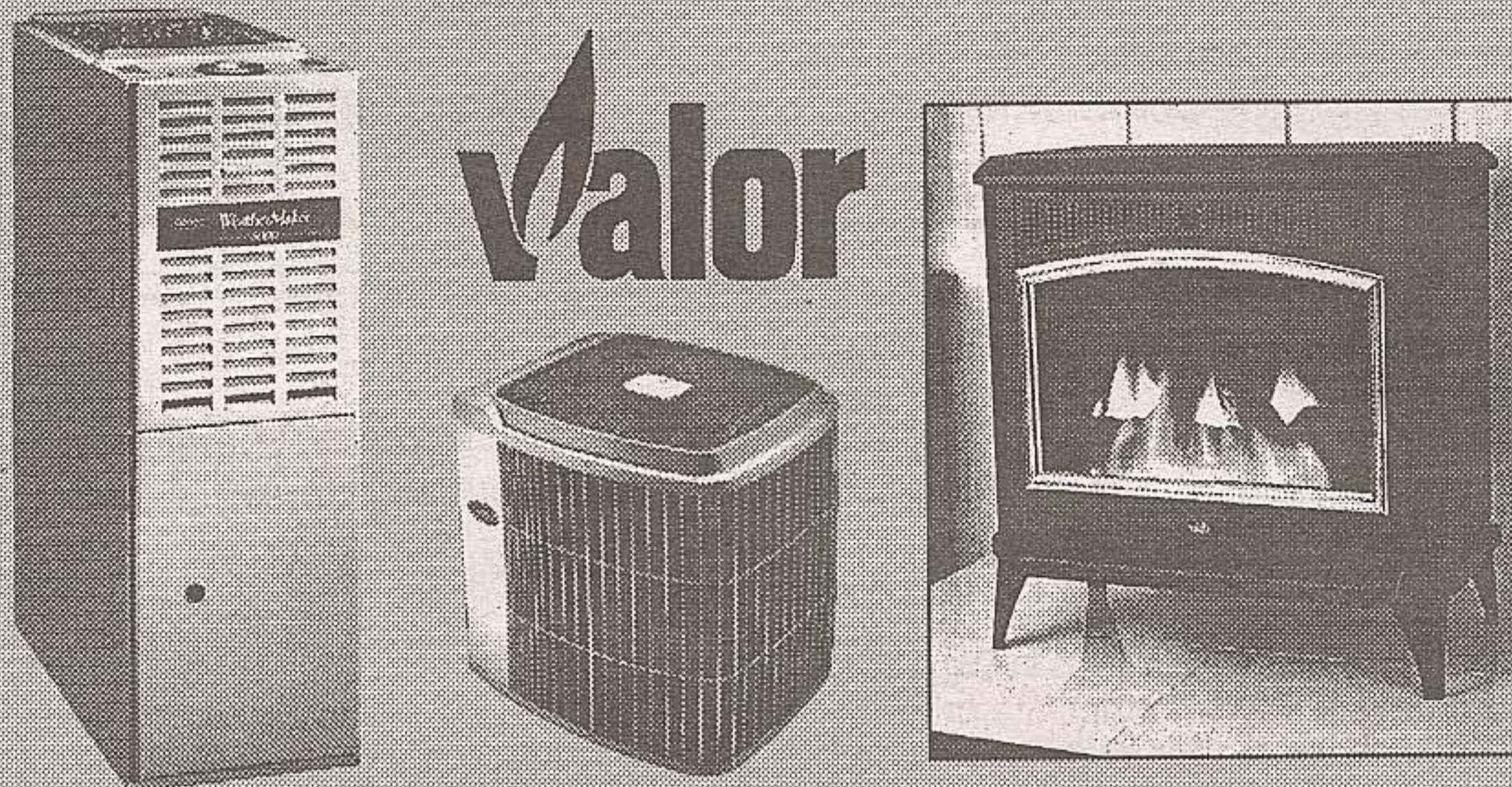
The Raiders dropped their second game 9-0 to Orangeville.

The Georgetown Racquet Club begins its fall house league season tomorrow (Monday) at 7 p.m. Visitors are welcome for an informal evening of squash.

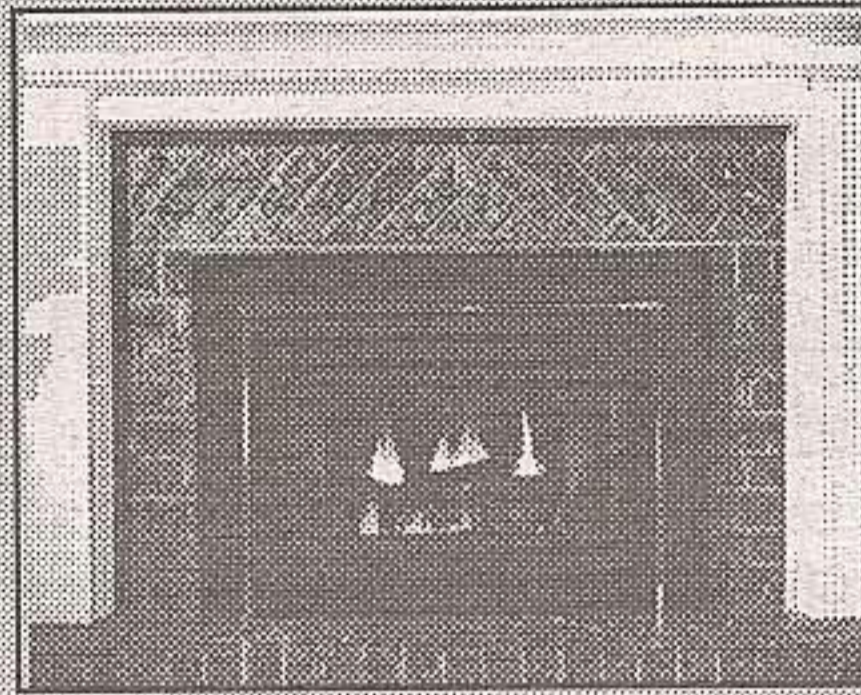
