Heritage Acton says it can save old arena— with help from the town and community

A "groundswell" of enthusiasm and financial support to save the old Acton arena has grown in the Acton community in recent weeks— enough that two local groups are proposing the town take a second look at the old building.

Heritage Acton and the Acton Agricultural Society (AAS) say they

can— with the town's help— turn the 70-year-old building in Prospect Park into a useful facility for the community for another 25 years. All they need is about \$500,000 to do it.

The group proposed, at Monday's council meeting, the town chip in the amount budgeted for the arena's demolition plus the amount to rehabilitate the

site— about \$200,000 altogether. As well, AAS will chip in \$80,000 of its reserve fund and Heritage Acton will contribute its fund-raising expertise to raise about \$300,000 in the community.

Speaking to council on the proposal, AAS rep Daniel Varanelli said "this renovation is an achievable prospect... it will be a gem for Halton Hills."

The combined Heritage Acton/AAS report outlined an annual operating budget of about \$40,000, and would be used by various clubs for meetings, storage, or non-ice sports like indoor soccer or in-line skaters.

"I think as the building becomes available we will be bombarded by requests," said Varanelli. He emphasized there would be no ice in the arena.

However, without the town's money, the project would not be possible, said Varanelli. He noted once the town cedes responsibility for the building to Heritage Acton, that group will accept all financial obligations for the building— even if the fund-raising effort fails.

Heritage Acton member Mac Sprowl presented council with a 1,701 signed petition supporting the saving of the arena. Sprowl, optimistic the group can raise the funds in the community, said the group has already received substantial pledges.

Council was non-committal about the report. It will discuss it at the same time, it discusses a staff report on the tendering for the demolition of the old arena. That's expected to come back to council by the end of the month.

LANDLORDS WITH GROSS LEASES
Under the provisions of provincial legislation, landlords with eligible gross leases who want to recover a portion of their 1998 property taxes or Business Improvement Area (BIA) charges from their tenants were required to notify tenants of this intention in writing by July 15th, 1998. These landlords were also required to notify tenants in writing by September 30, 1998 of the actual amount of property taxes or BIA charges that tenants would be required to pay for the year.

Recently the provincial Minister of Finance announced his intention to introduce legislation which, if passed, will amend the provisions for the delivery of notices by landlords with gross leases as follows:

- deadline date by which landlords with gross leases must provide tenants with a notice requiring payment of property taxes or BIA charges extended to October 16, 1998;
- landlords with gross leases to have the option of providing tenants with only one notice (a notice requiring payment) rather than two notices (a notice of intent to require payment and a notice requiring payment).

This extension will allow landlords who may have missed the July 15th deadline to still require tenants to pay property taxes or BIA charges in 1998 if the landlords deliver the indicated notice by October 16th.

Please note that these notices will only have legal effect if the proposed legislation is passed.
