The Raiders tied their opening game 2-2 against Markham. Jordan Armstrong and Brad Norton scored with Sean Graham and Gavin Alridge assisting.

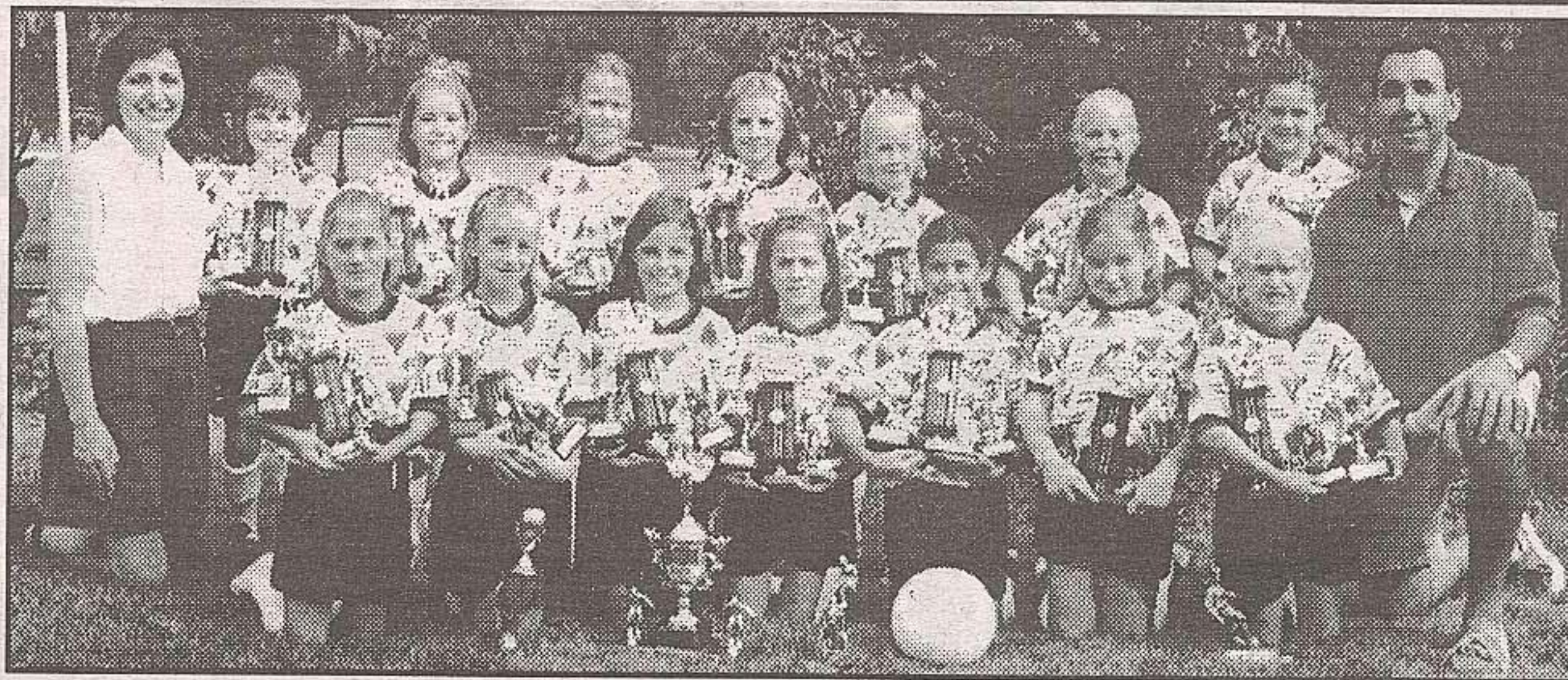
The Raiders were edged by Pickering 3-2 in their second game. Steve Kogon and Norton scored, set up by Cole and Zelek.
