Town getting ready for year 2000

the Town of Halton Hills has formed a committee with representation from every department to inventory, set priority, set strategy, test and provide contingency planning for the year 2000.

The town is projecting a first quarter 1999 date for their readiness for the year 2000. For further information contact Christine Campbell, chair of the year 2000 committee at 873-2601, ext. 210.

Tonight (Wednesday), from 7-9 p.m., the town is hosting an information meeting at the Civic Centre to offer you an opportunity to register your millennium project or event. Help us reach our goal of 2000 celebrations by calling the millennium hotline at 873-2601, ext. 2000 to register.

Anything goes, big or small, family reunions, neighborhood gatherings to tournaments and community wide special events. We will also provide as much information as know about available millennium grants through the federal government.

Another phase of construction of Georgetown South Community Park is underway this fall.

Current initiatives include remedial grading and sub drain installation work to improve drainage in the hardball diamond infield, and in the area behind the backstop of the adjacent intermediate softball diamond. Ten sets of aluminum bleachers will be installed within the park to provide more permanent seating for spectators. A fall planting program will be underway later this month involving the installation of approximately 80 shade trees along the pathways and the central entry medians at the Eighth Line entrance to the park.

Weather permitting, work will commence next month on the first phase of the play area which will provide the necessary grading, pathways, sand areas and site servicing for what will be a major play facility. Pending budget approval, large scale play structures will be installed to provide play opportunities in this central area of the park.

The Eighth Line reconstruction is on target and the first phase of the two lane roadway will




be built half way to the Fifteen Sideroad. A paved multi-use lighted pathway on the east side of the road is also included. The fall work should be complete by the end of November. The landscaping and final asphalt work is scheduled for next spring. The above is financed through development charges.

Construction of the Alcott Park skateboard facility will be completed shortly. The facility was designed by Landscape Architects Victor Ford and Associates Inc. of Toronto and incorporates the concrete ramps, stairs, and wall features that provide skateboarders with moderately challenging surface specifically designed for skateboarding. With continued community involvement, the final landscape work will be in place this month as volunteers install sod and shrubs along the Guelph Street frontage of the facility. This is a unique facility, and requires responsible use.

The Halton Hills Library is wrapping up its four years of Centennial Celebrations with the Mayor's Dinner and Country Jamboree at the new Acton Arena Community Hall. The evening begins with a delicious supper, a concert featuring Harry Bryan, a silent auction, and a dance— an entertaining evening designed for everyone.
