Atom II Raiders

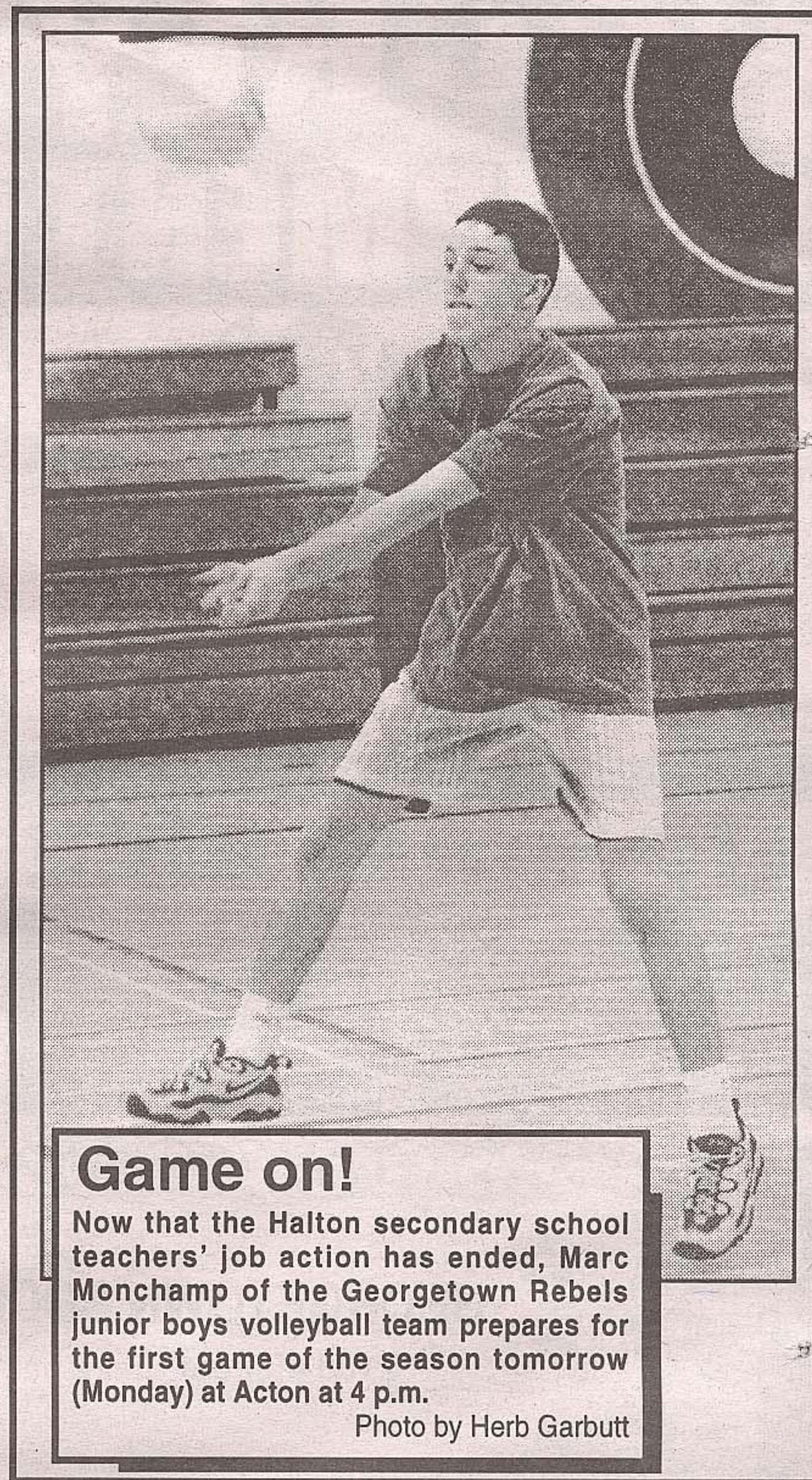
The Georgetown Atom II Raiders offence exploded as they buried Hespeler 13-4.

Spears third at tourney

Brad Spears of Georgetown carded a two-round total of 149 to finish third at the Kangaroo's Colonial Invitational at Robert Morris College in Coraopolis, Pa.

Spears, playing for the University of Detroit Mercy Titans, shot an opening round of 75 then, despite windy conditions, bettered his score with a 74.

"Brad played some really good golf," said Titan coach Mark Engel. "He's playing with that confidence you love to see as either a coach or just a fan of the game. He's thinking every ball is going down the middle of the fairway and every approach shot is going to knock down the pin. This has really been a breakthrough for Brad."

It was Spears' second straight top-10 finish after he tied for eighth the previous week at the McLaughlin/Gimmler Intercollegiate. It was also the second straight tournament that the sophomore golfer was the top Titan in the field.

As a team, the Titans finished fifth in the 16-team field with a two-round total of 632, nine shots off the lead.

In other college golf play, Mike Kotsos of Georgetown shot a three-round total of 236 as the Bowling Green State University Falcons finished tied for 14th at the Xavier Invitational. Kotsos struggled with an 85 in the opening round but rebounded with a 77. The final day he carded three-over-par 74 to help the Falcons post the best team score (290) of the round.
