

anticipating the 1999 season as he launches GolfNorth Properties. The owner of the Acton Golf Club (formerly Acton Meadows) since 1994, has added four courses to his stable that already included the local Calerin Golf Club and Beaverdale Golf Club in Cambridge, bought prior to this season. His new acquisitions are the Brant Valley Golf Club in St. George, Orangeville Golf Club, Woodstock Golf Club and Fairview Golf Club, east of Fergus. A one-price membership will allow golfers to play all seven courses.

"When I bought Calerin (in 1996), I saw an opportunity for a regional golfing," Kavanagh said. "It's such a unique opportunity because you drive 20 or 25 minutes and play on four different courses. If there's a tournament going on at one course, there's another course 15 minutes away."

Like he did with Acton this year, Kavanagh intends to expand the existing nine-hole courses to 18 holes. That includes Calerin, Orangeville and Woodstock. All the clubs will remain semi-private.

"A lot of courses are going private or fully public. There's no middle ground anymore," Kavanagh said. "We want to have that balance between members and non-mem-

GolfNorth membership will be limited and divided up amongst 12 different membership categories (including junior, intermediate, senior, sevenday, five-day and four-day memberships). Memberships will be discounted by \$200 (\$100 for junior members) until Nov. 30.

"A membership works out to about \$30 a week," Kavanagh said. "So if you play once a week it has paid itself off, plus you get the benefit of playing a number of different courses."

GolfNorth also offers a chance to own a piece of the courses you play. It became a publicly traded company and shares currently sell for between \$2.50 and \$3. Kavanagh said becoming a publicly traded company will help the company have access to more capital to add more courses or make improvements to the existing courses.


