### Motion passes by 6-5 vote

# Council gives go-ahead to level Acton Arena

more than 50 Acton residents could not sway the votes of six councillors, and Halton Hills council voted, at Monday's meeting, to demolish the old Acton Arena.

Council confirmed its decision made last week. Once again a request for deferral by Acton Councillor Norm Elliott was rejected by six of the 11 councillors. Representatives of Acton Agricultural Society (AAS) and Heritage Acton (HA), backed by residents of all ages, were at the meeting to urge councillors to save the 70-year-old building

from the wrecker's ball.

"Let's not tear it down until we're absolutely sure (that the group can't raise enough money over the winter to restore the building)," said Ted Tyler, spokesperson for the joint committee of HA and AAS. "Once it's gone, it's gone."

He accused the town of having a predetermined position on the building's demolition, never once offering to work with the HA/AAS committee to help save the building.

Tuesday morning, Tyler said he was

personally disappointed with the council decision, noting that a difference in one vote could have saved the building. A post mortem meeting of HA/AAS committee will be held next Tuesday to determine future action, he said.

Daniel Varanelli, Acton Agricultural Society's rep, spoke about the AAS's six years of frustration with the town's "bureaucratic red tape and hidden agendas." He said councillors' viewpoints that the building must be demolished to protect the
