## Council vote spells end for Acton Arena

public's safety and to be fiscally responsible were developed simply to push the town's agenda.

Varanelli once again requested the building be turned over to the AAS for use as a non-profit community centre, along with the \$137,000 budgeted for demolition.

Varanelli said the AAS preferred the older arena to the possiblity of a new shed-like structure that could be

built to replace it. The restoration of the old arena would bring better value, he said, adding he was confident that the \$300,000 needed to be raised in the community for its restoration could be achieved.

Elliott was willing to give the group that chance.

"Let's not picture the worst-case scenario (roof collapse and people getting killed)," he urged his fellow councillors. He said the group should be given time to establish whether money can be raised in the community. "If they aren't given the chance, nobody will

ever know."

"All we're asking is that the town put up \$10,0000 (for fencing the building) and that may have the potential of getting a facility in town worth well over half a million dollars. That's not a bad gamble and I'm willing to take that gamble," said Acton Councillor Rick Bonnette.

Councillor Jane Fogal, in opposing the deferral bid, said the Acton groups did not present a convincing business plan while Councillor Kevin Kuiack suggested the building's restoration may eventually take revenues away from the newer \$5.4 million Acton Arena.

Demolition of the old arena will likely begin before the end of the year, said Paul Stover, manager of facilities. Currently the elimination of hazardous substances in the building is being dealt with. Demolition will not start before the Acton Santa Claus Parade on Nov. 21 which is using the parking lot as its endpoint, he said.


