"I was his second choice," Dorothy said. "He asked someone else to dance first."


But 10 months later Dorothy

## CELEBRITY COOKS

This recipe is an all time favourite at the Wilsons.

#### **PAVLOVA**

5 Egg Whites 10 oz. sugar 1 teaspoon vinegar 2 teaspoons corn flour 1/2 teaspoon vanilla

**COOKING TIME:** 1 HOUR Oven 230°C - 450°F Reduced to 120°C - 250°F

TOPPING: 300 ml Whipping Cream •Strawberries or any fruit

Draw a 9 inch circle on sheet of non-stick parchment paper on a baking sheet. Beat the eggs until stiff, then gradually beat in 10 ozs. of sugar, a little at a time until thick & glossy. Beat in vinegar, corn flour & vanilla. Spoon meringue on to the circle of parchment, swirling it with a knife to make the mixture level.

Put meringue in oven & turn down immediately to very cool. Bake for 1 hour until crisp & firm on the outside. Remove parchment paper. Serve with whipped cream & strawberries on top.
