Children to campaign for UNICEF on Halloween

TNICEF collection boxes are being distributed to elementary students this week. For more than 43 years, the UNICEF Halloween collection campaign has been been a trick-or-treating tradition in Halton Hills.

The 1998 goal is to raise \$4 million on Halloween night for UNICEF.

This year, there is a new program for preschoolers. At participating Rogers Video locations, parents can register their preschoolers to receive a collection box. Included will be instructions on how to send the money to UNICEF.

The coins collected by the youngsters are used by UNICEF to fund four areas of support: education, water, health care and nutrition, said Beth Berton-Hunter of UNICEF Ontario.

According to UNICEF, a donation of \$1 could be used to immunize 12 children against measles, or buy three packets of lettuce seeds to feed a community. Thirty-five cents will buy 15 vitamin A capsules, which can protect children from blindness. Seventy-five cents will buy exercise books for 15 school children, and 80 cents will buy 72 sticks of dustless chalk.

A little goes a long way, said Berton-Hunter, as the average collection box contains \$2 worth of coins.
