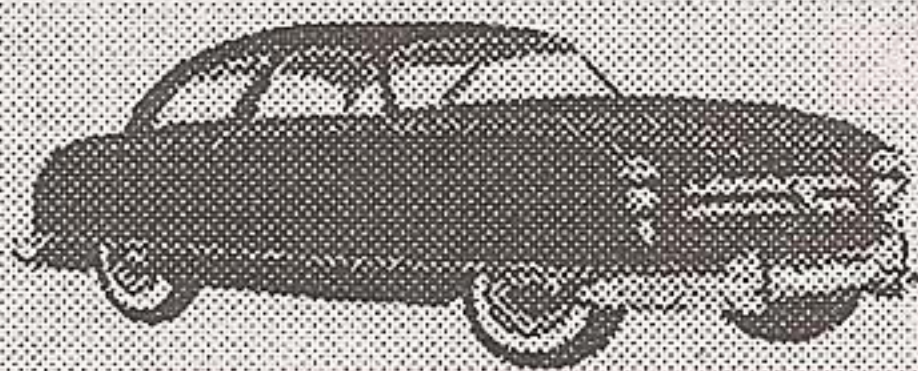


## Mayor's Gala on Nov. 14

# Radio club to patrol streets on Halloween

There will be some extra sets of eyes out on Halloween night to ensure the evening is a safe one.

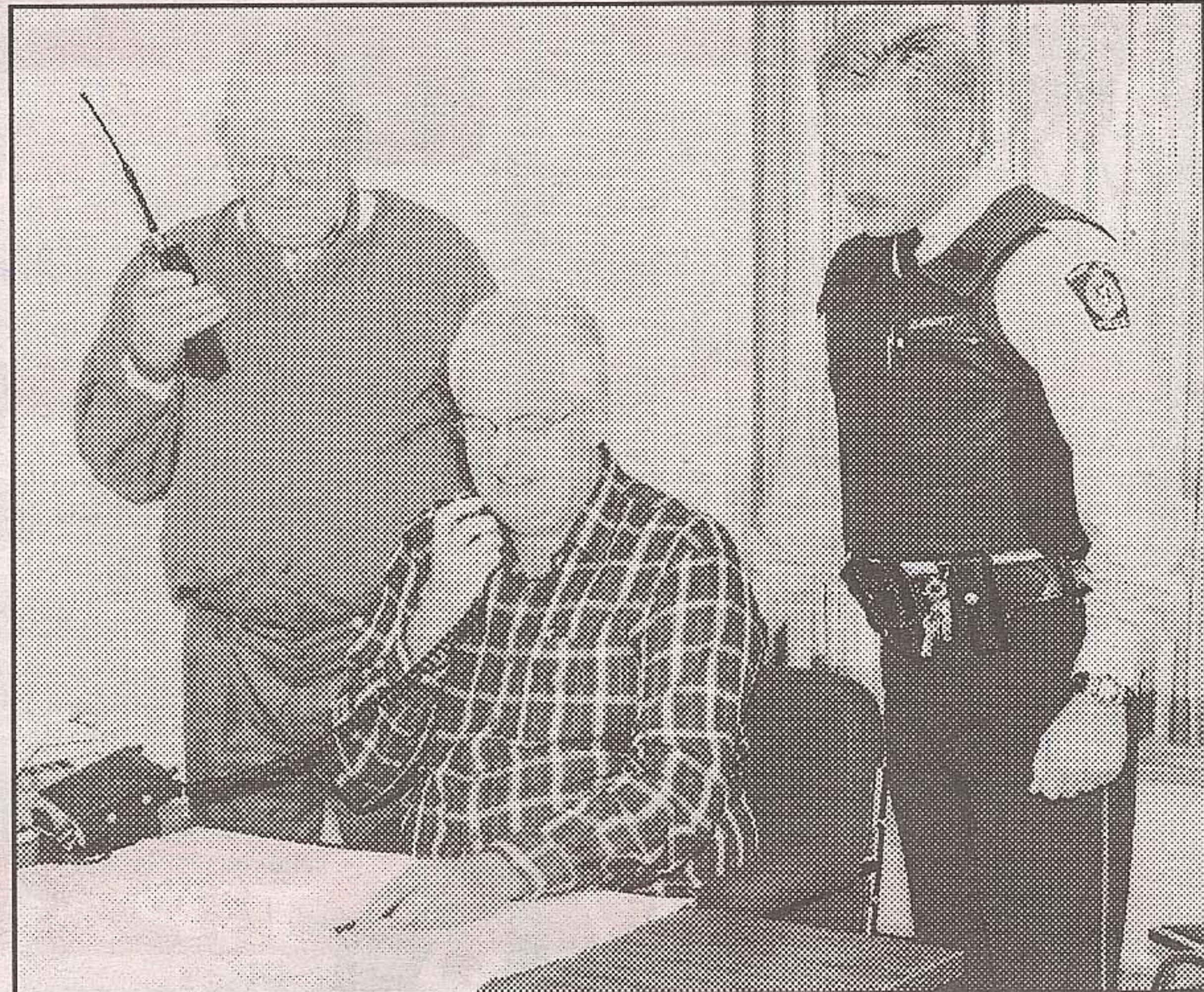
As they have in the past, members of the Halton Amateur Radio Club will be out in their cars with their radios on Halloween (Saturday) and on Devil's Night (Friday) looking for any troublemakers. They will be visiting the known hot spots in Acton and Georgetown as well as the rural area.

If they see any potential trouble they will report it to their amateur radio counterpart who will be working out of the police station in Georgetown, which will allow for police to be notified immediately.

"We never get involved, we just report it," said club member J.M. (Mike) Davis.

This Halloween, as it has done in past years, Laidlaw Transit Ltd. will have their familiar yellow and black vans patrolling the streets in Georgetown between 6 and 8 p.m. to enhance the safety of the kids out collecting candy. Each van will be equipped inside with a flashing Jack-O-Lantern so they will be easy to spot.

Laidlaw drivers, who have volunteered their time, will be in radio contact with their office so they can call for help if needed and the vans can
