Sterritt, who also has a regional cross-country skiing title to her credit, finished second in Thursday's race at the Kelso Conservation Area in Milton. But, Sterritt was the top finisher from Halton in the race, won by St. Mary's (Hamilton) Leanne Rowthorn, that also served as the Golden Horseshoe Athletic Conference championship as well.

With two others in the top-10, Georgetown also took the Halton team title. Katie White was ninth and Sheena Butler was 10th. Meredith Sones finished 14th and Kristin Finlay was 24th to round out the team that went to Ontario Federation of Schools Athletic Association (OFSAA) championship in Toronto yesterday (Saturday). Lisa Ershler just missed out, finishing 25th.

The senior boys team also won the Halton championship, led by Glen Wood in sixth and Robbie Adams in seventh. Maurice Gear placed 11th and Topher Baker was 15th. Ryan Gledhill will be the fifth member of the team that will go to the provincial championships. He was 20th. Other GDHS finishers were Jason Estevan (24th), Kevin Moore (25th), Jim Harper (28th) and Ben Redman (29th).

out on a Halton and GHAC title, finishing second to Milton's Laura Thistle by two seconds in the midget girls race. Adams' performance was en-
