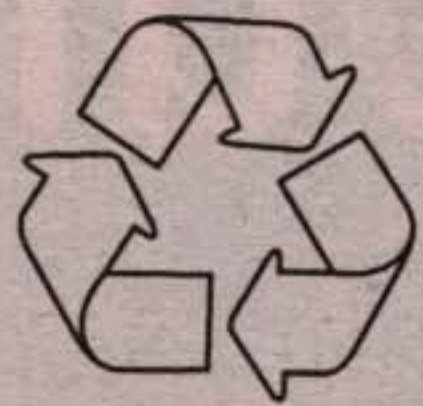

Moon Over Buffalo opens Friday

Georgetown Little Theatre's newest comedy, Moon Over Buffalo, opens this week at the John Elliott Theatre.

The play ran on Broadway starring Carol Burnett, and most recently played on Stage West with Cindy Williams.

Al, who manages the local Shopper's Drug Mart, has his first speaking role in Moon Over Buffalo. He is joined by Shoppers dispensary assistant Cindy Murnaghan and former stock clerk Mike DeRyck, who plays Howard, the fiance. Sue Stoddard, a cashier has been dragged into being a stagehand, so all the store staff can't wait to attend.

"We are having a riot," says cast member Pat Ball, who plays the deaf mother-in-law Edith. "It's so funny, the cast can't stop laughing...even though we have seen it dozens of times. No wonder it was such a success on Broadway."

The romance between Roz (Murnaghan) and Paul (Paul D'Entremont) is deja vu for the young actors. They were lovers in a GDHS production of Play It Again Sam 14 years ago. D'Entremont has done many shows with GLT and Globe, and has impeccable comic timing.

Leading man Mark Tiller, a veteran of many GLT comedies, tackles the part of George, the zany but lovable fading star. Known as Reverend Tiller to Acton folks, Mark uses his considerable "pulpit" voice and magnificent stage presence to bring the ego-maniac George to life.

"This is a dream cast," says director Steve Provost. "The audience is in for a great time."
