FROM THE TOP OF GIBB'S HILL LIGHTHOUSE IN BEAUTIFUL BERMUDA one can see from shoreline to shoreline and further out to sea on this very unique 19.5 square mile island average winter temperature 19 Celsius, just two and one half hours flight time away - A MUST-SEE FOR EVERYONE! There are folks who go back to Bermuda year after year, but if you haven't yet visited there, do plan to go at least once! There is a variety of accommodation - small intimate guest houses right up to the luxurious resorts -AUNT NEA'S INN, a 200 year old guest house in St. Georges, to the HAMILTON PRINCESS in Hamilton, to match your level of need and affordability. (It must be mentioned here that it is expensive their currency is on a par with the U.S. dollar, plus because most if not all items are imported, the costs are, let's just say higher than here!)



RENT A 'MOPED' OR 'SCOOTER' (if you are so inclined - they do drive on the left side of the road!) and tour the entire island - from ST. GEORGES at one end to the DOCKYARD at the other. Similar to a British Isles setting with narrow roads, vine covered stone fences, overhanging aging trees, greenery everywhere, including on their many FANTASTIC GOLF COURSES, with their spectacular views. Go SCUBA DIVING in their clear, pristine waters or visit the AQUARIUM, MUSEUM and ZOO - we joined in for THE CURATOR'S TOUR of the attraction first established in 1926 (one of the oldest anywhere!) recently, and thoroughly enjoyed participating amid the angelfish, barracuda, seals, parrots, tortoises, reptiles.
