Red Dawn fares well at World Open Plata pleased with silver medal

Red Dawn Martial Arts proved to be a fitting Canadian representative at the recent fourth World Open Tae Kwon Do Championship in Birmingham, England.

The Brampton club sent six athletes with three of them placing at the competition which included athletes from more than 30 countries.

Duane Plata took a silver in musical patterns. The 26-year-old, second degree black belt was making his international debut at the meet.

Plata, an instructor at the Red Dawn club in Georgetown, was pleasantly surprised by his performance.

"I expected to do well but not that well," he said.

In musical patterns, the competitors performed a two-minute routine to music before a panel of five judges. Plata finished just a fraction of a point behind only one other athlete, from Holland. Plata included back flips and a jump kick in his routine.

"That surprised the judges," he said.

It drew him scores of 9.7 and 9.6 out of a maximum 10.

Plata didn't compete in the sparring competition.

Red Dawn is planning to send a team to the world team championship in Barcelona, Spain in the spring.

Acton High School Athletes of the Week are Craig Lockwood and Jeff Birrell.

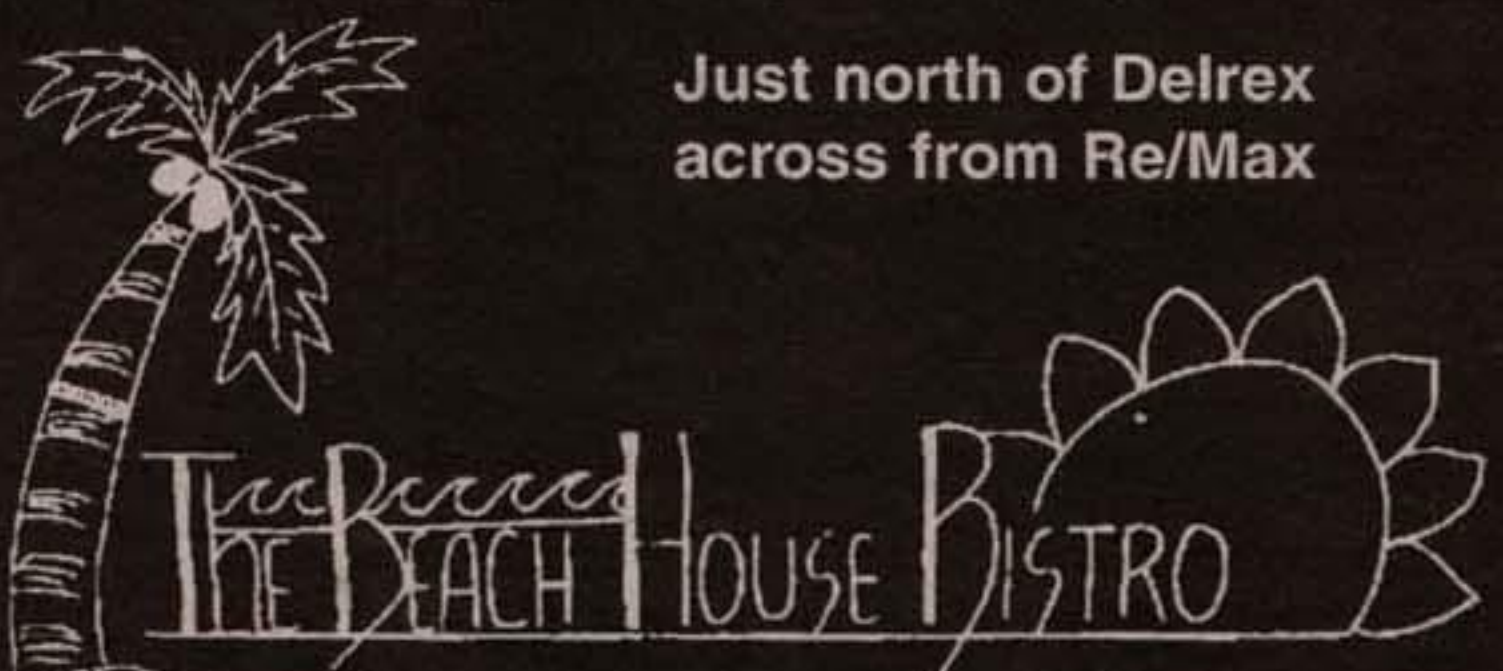
Lockwood was chosen for his contribution as setter on
