Hospital volunteer group marks 40th anniversary

I uriel Adams became the founding president of the Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital Women's Auxiliary on Nov. 8, 1958. Thus began a 40-year history of volunteers in green smocks providing cheerful faces, friendly greetings and helping hands to patients, staff and visitors.

Twenty-two presidents have followed in Adams' footsteps. Now in 1998, the name has changed to Volunteer Association and the first gentleman president, Ken Kavanagh, has been elected. But the objectives of service to patients and fund-raising remain the same.

Two of the founding members, Inez Crichton and Lois Graham continue to serve. The still active Vi Haines and the late Lena Johnson were both named Georgetown Citizens of the Year for their many hours of volunteering in the community. Another outstanding member was the late Blanche Goudeketting, founder of the Candystriper program.

Over the 40 years, the membership has grown to 200, but as service to patients expands, still more people are needed, male and female, to fill the gaps.

Over the years, the Volunteer Association has raised more than \$500,000 for the hospital, and therefore will be recognized on the soon-to-be unveiled Donor Wall in the highest category of giving— the Humanitarian level.


Monies raised have always been used for the purchase of clinical equipment, like heart or fetal monitors, trauma stretchers, nursery equipment, and a six-year project to replace all the patient beds with more comfortable modern electric beds has just been completed.

This coming year, the executive has targeted funds for a pulse oxymeter

and a video gastroscope.

Also celebrating its 40h year is the hospital's annual Christmas Dinner and Dance, the most traditional event of Georgetown's social scene. Dance conveners are expecting this year's gala on Dec. 5, to be especially festive as hospital supporters help celebrate the volunteers' 40 years of dedication.
