The Halton Regional Health Department is offering flu shots:

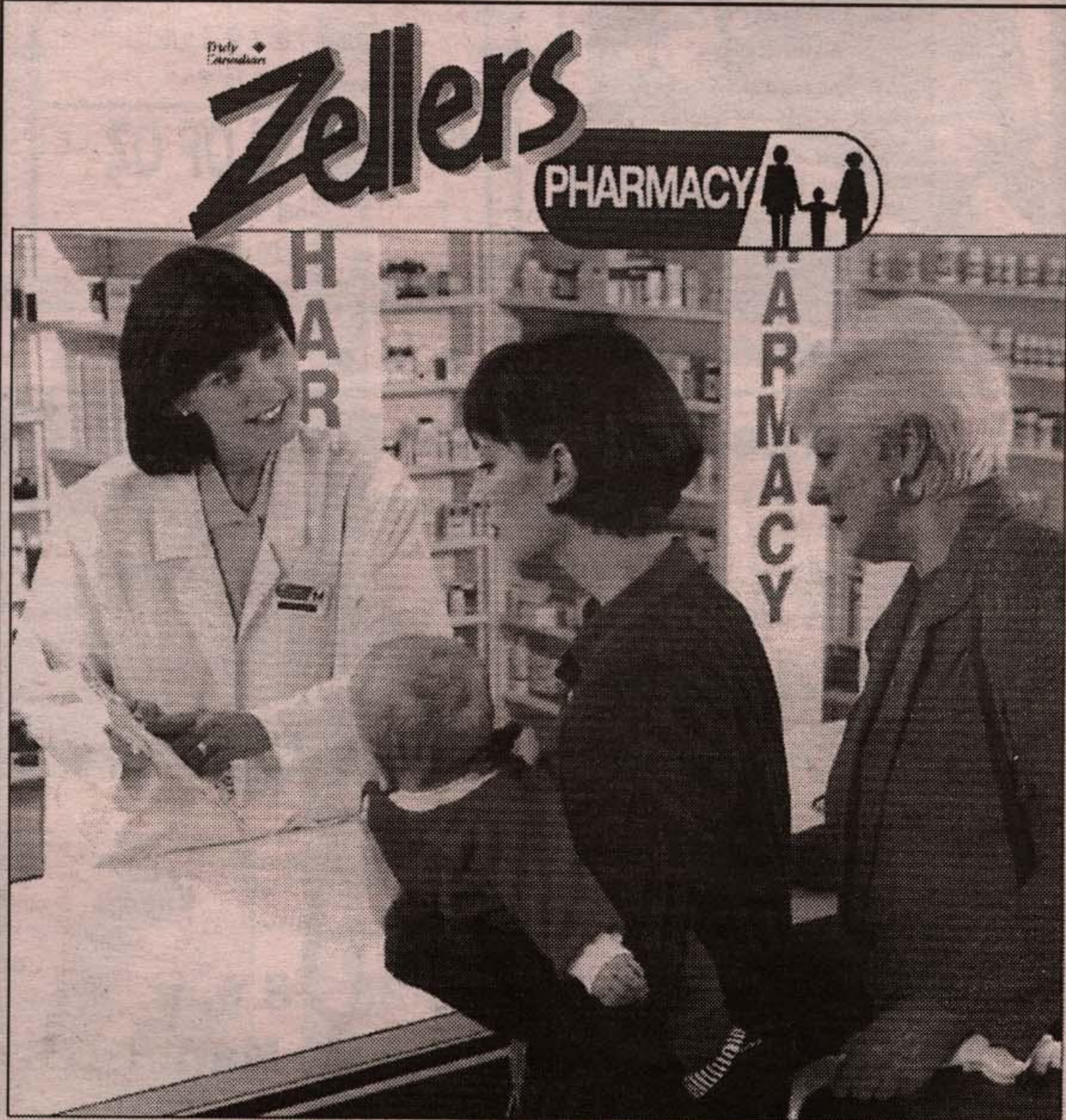
