The Raiders' week began with a 2-2 tie against Acton. Joel Hamilton set up both Finn and Moxham for the goals. Critchell also had an assist.

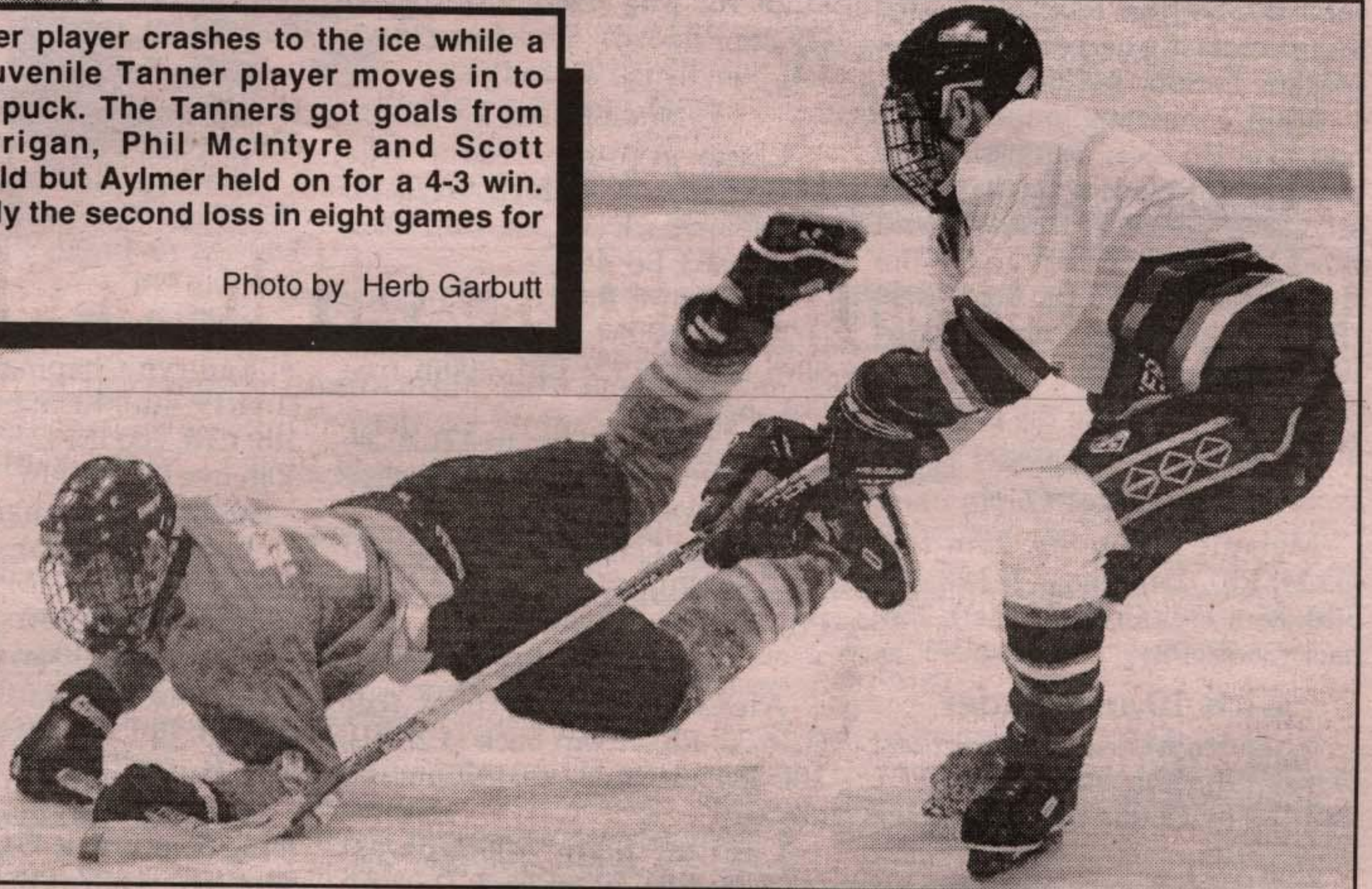
Seven Select Raiders
