

Gems capture B final of Georgetown Oldtimers Tournament

Doug Fry scored four times and set up Bill Kirby's goal to lead the Gems to a 5-2 victory over the Bolton Canadians in the B final of the recent Georgetown Hockey Heritage Council Oldtimers Tournament.

The Gems went undefeated in three games prior to the final with two wins and a tie. Fry, the Gems' MVP, finished the tournament with seven goals and five assists in four games. Ian Symes was another big contributor to the offence with three goals and four assists while Glenn Tost posted an goals-against average of 2.00 in four games.

The Gems opened the tournament with a 6-2 win over Bolton. They followed that up by downing the Brantford Prairie Wolves 5-3 before settling for a 1-1 draw with Fackoury Building Supply.

Pat Maloney and Doug Tate each had two goals as the Sports Unlimited Beavers defeated Caledon 6-1 in the C final. Charlie Shaw and Juri Kudrasovs also scored for Sports Unlimited. Tate, who took team MVP honors, and

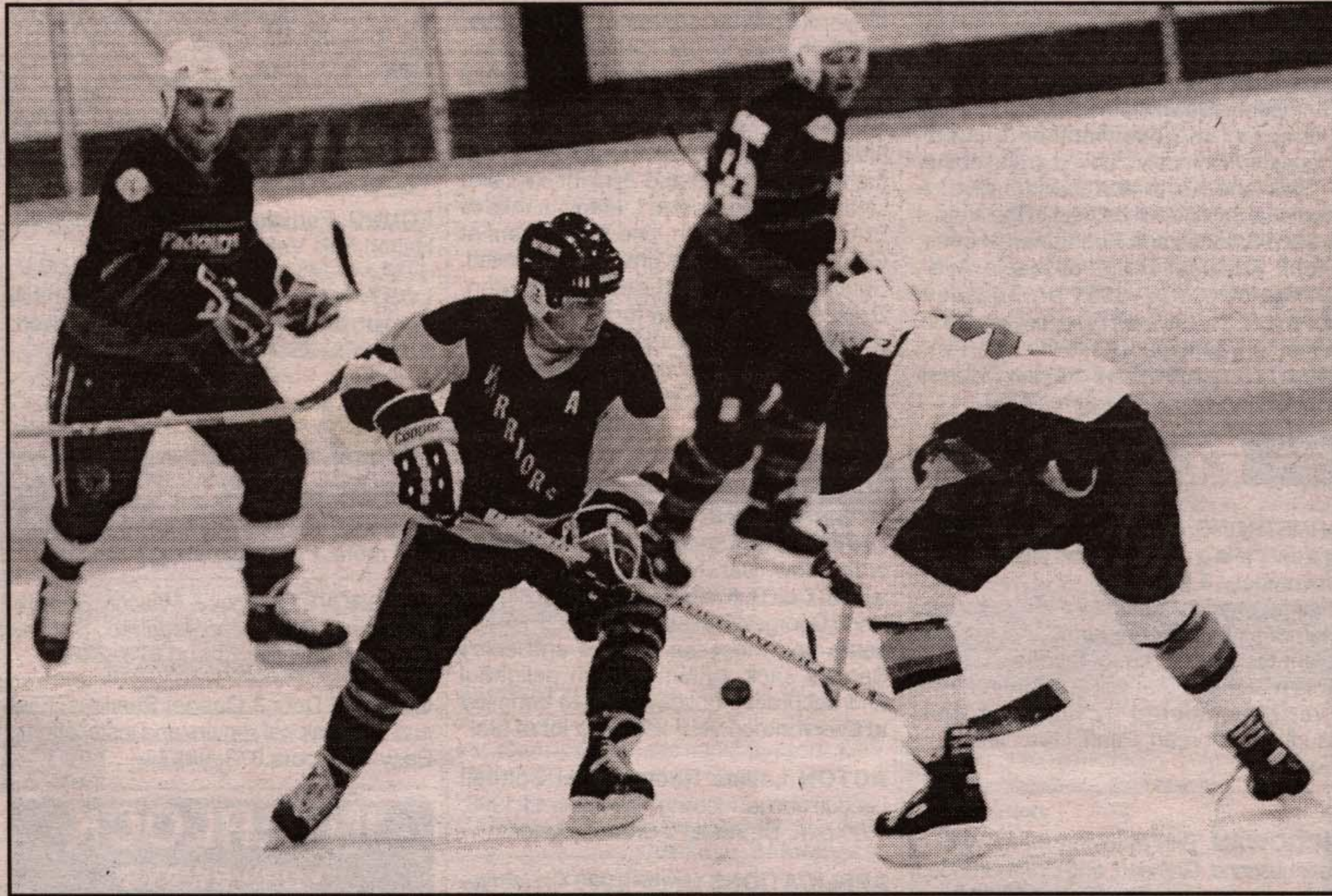
Scott Lindsay each had a pair of assists. Tate finished the tournament with three goals and three assists while Lindsay had three goals and two assists. Bob Dugan and Shaw each had four points in the tournament.

Sports Unlimited was undefeated in round-robin play. They defeated the Erin Ancients 7-4, beat the Caledon Rustcheckers 6-1 and tied Coxwell Sports Collectables 1-1.

Chris Rowsell scored in a shootout to help the Acton Stingers edge the Old Pistons 5-4 in the D Division final. Rowsell also scored twice in regulation time while Acton MVP Scott Lindsay had the other three goals. John Baker chipped in with a pair of assists.

The Stingers outscored their opponents 17-5 in three victories leading up to the final, led by Lindsay's five goals and three assists. Rowsell had two goals and set up two more and Brad McMeekin had a goal and two assists. Acton doubled the Brampton Burnouts 4-2, blasted Clarkson 9-2 and defeated Flamboro 4-1.

Kevin Timons scored twice as the Renegades downed the

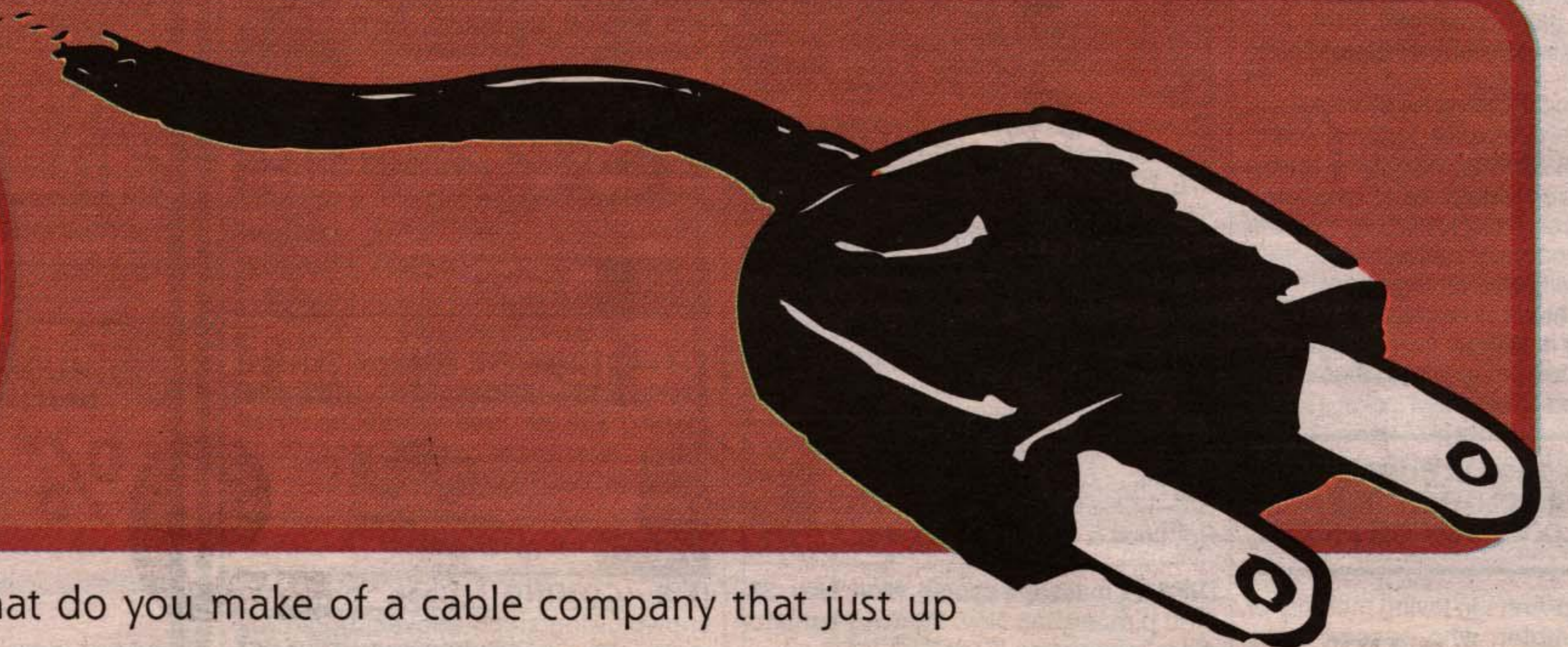
