# Lapointe top Canadian at World Amateur Championship

ary Ann Lapointe fired a 71 in the final round of the LWomen's World Amateur Golf Championships to help Canada salvage a 13th-place finish.

Lapointe's one-under-par round on Sunday was the best by a Canadian at the world amateur championships in Santiago, Chile. The Canadian team finished with a four-round total of 599, just three strokes out of the top-10.

The United States, with a total of 558, ran away with the victory, winning by a record 21 shots over Italy and Germany.

"We're all disappointed," said team captain Marlene Streit. "The girls were very well prepared. We were hoping for a better result. I'm not pleased. I'm sure the girls aren't pleased either."

Lapointe was the top Canadian finisher with a fourround total of 298. Teammate Isabelle Blais finished at 303

while Kareen Qually shot 306 over the four rounds.

Lapointe opened the tournament with a round of 75 and followed it up with a 76.

"I had four birdies, four bogies and two doubles," she said via e-mail following the second round.


"I am hitting the ball well but I ran into trouble on the 14th and 15th holes. Two double-bogeys crept up on me. I

finished strong going one under for the last three holes. We're playing well and the jitters are gone for everyone."

Lapointe continued to hit the ball well in the third round but her putter failed her again.

"I hit 15 greens today and shot 76. I hit the ball great all day and couldn't sink a putt."

Lapointe had five birdies in the final round, including one on the final hole to come in under par.

# Confident Raiders overcome adversity to post 8-6 victory

There is something in the Georgetown Raider dressing room that has been missing for far too long-confidence.

Saturday's storyline was just one dash of hope away from being a perfect recipe for disaster but the Raiders showed remarkable for a poise for a young team. Georgetown surrendered two powerplay goals to the Burlington Cougars in the final two minutes, the last with just 43 seconds remaining to tie the game.

But, before the ghosts of Raider failures past had a chance to stir, Stace Page dropped the puck back

to Mike L'Heureux, whose shot beat Burlington goalie Jeff Van der Spyker to the stick side with 33 seconds to play. Scott MacDonald then deposited the puck into the empty net to complete his first career hat-trick and an 8-6 victory that in past years would not have likely gone in the Raiders' favor.

"This year's a lot different," said L'Heureux. "We had the talent (last wear) but this year everyone is working hard and wants to win."

"I just had that feeling that we were going to win even after they tied it," said Page, who racked up nine points in the two weekend games. "Everyone just felt that was our game."

However, confidence can be fragile. And a loss to Burlington could have had disastrous results, especially coming on the heels of a 6-5 loss to Hamilton on Friday, a game the Raiders should have

> won. "We were so close (Friday)," said defenceman Ryan Fairbarn, who had five points in the two games. "It would have just killed us to lose tonight."

If it hadn't killed them, it certainly would have wounded their playoff hopes. The win, their fourth in their last five games, improved the Raiders to 9-11-1 and helped them keep pace in a tight race for fifth through ninth in the Provincial Jr. A Hockey League's

West Conference. The weekend included many highlights for the Raiders. Peter Veltman recorded his third straight two-goal game on Friday and then added his seventh goal in four games on Saturday. Gene Spadaro, reunited with Mac-
