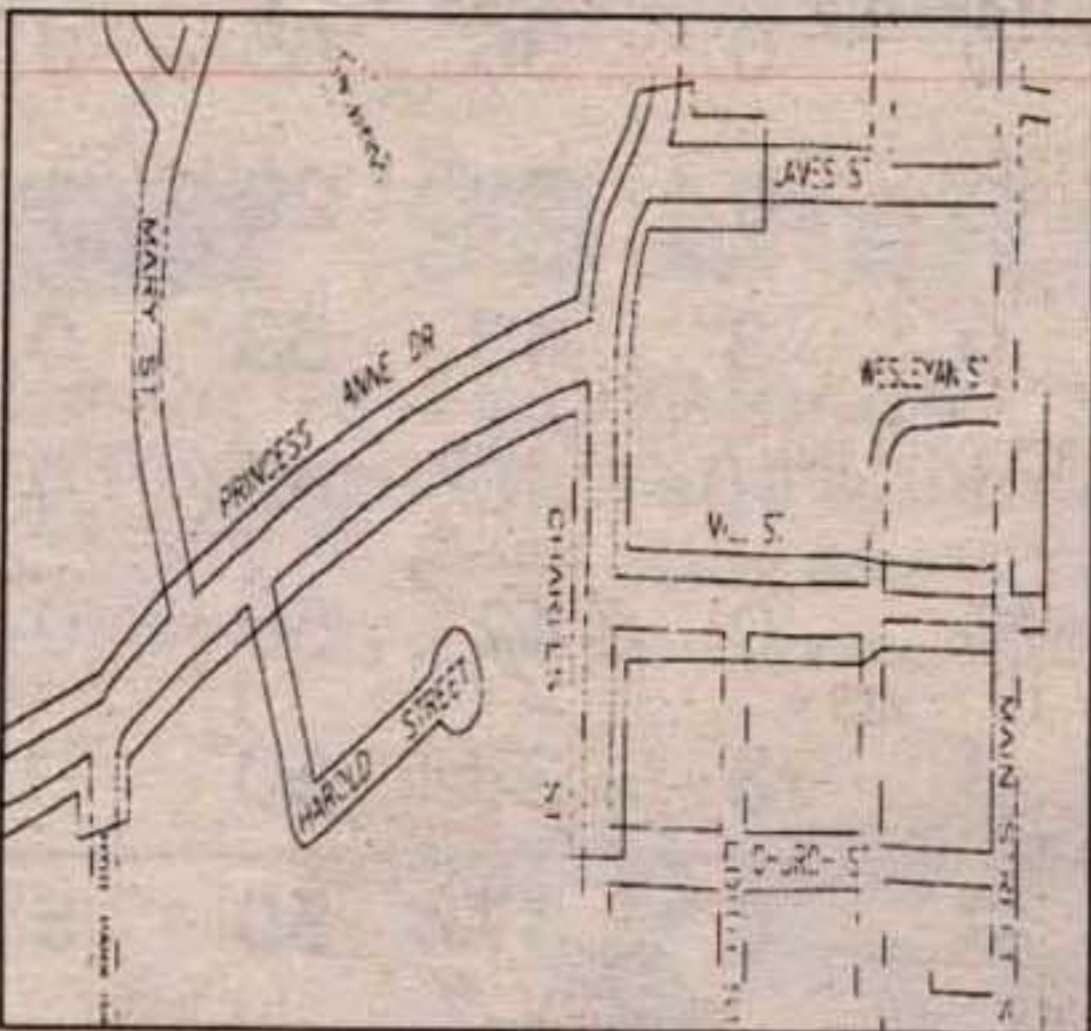

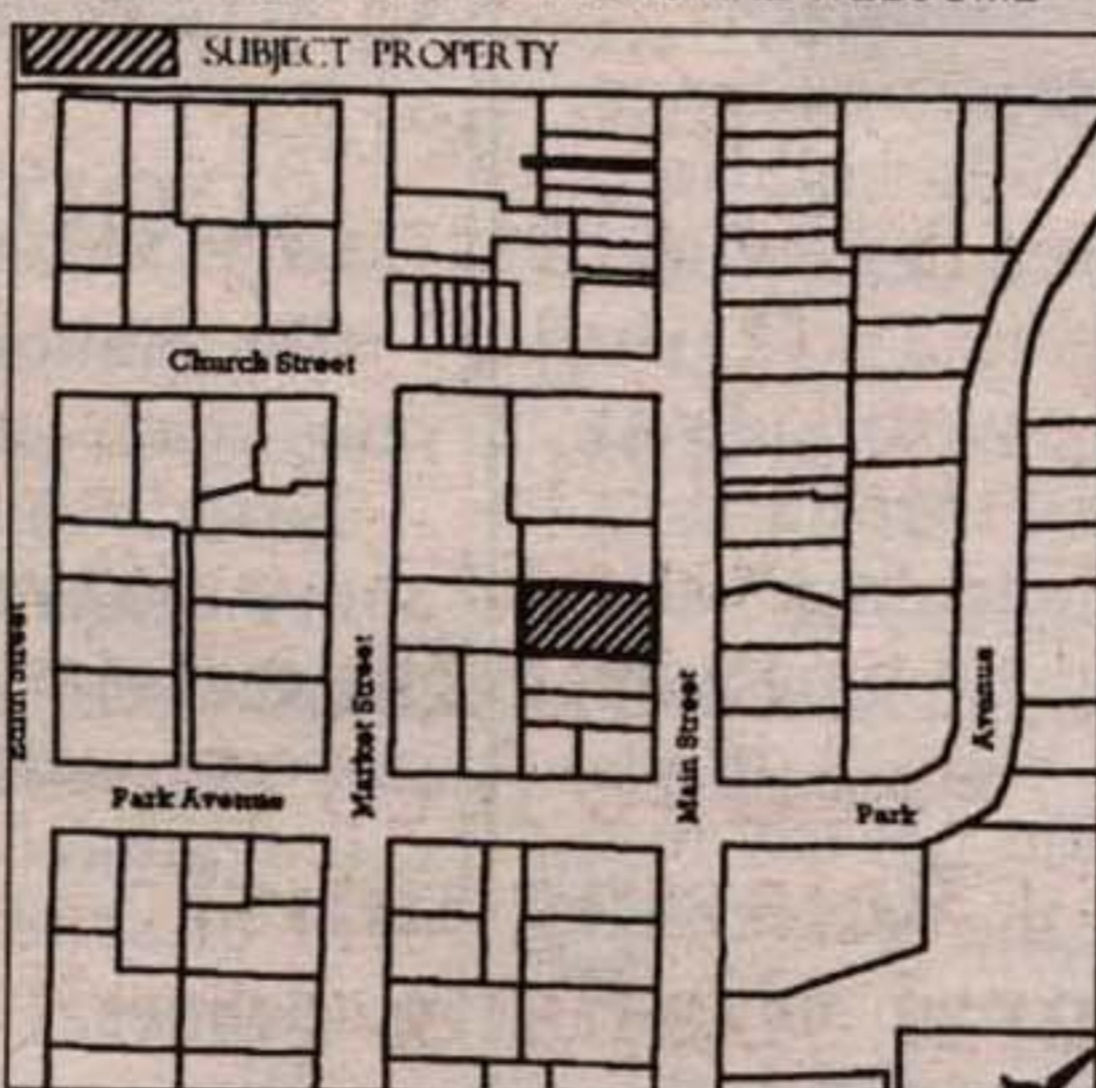
WARD 3/MAIN STREET SOUTH

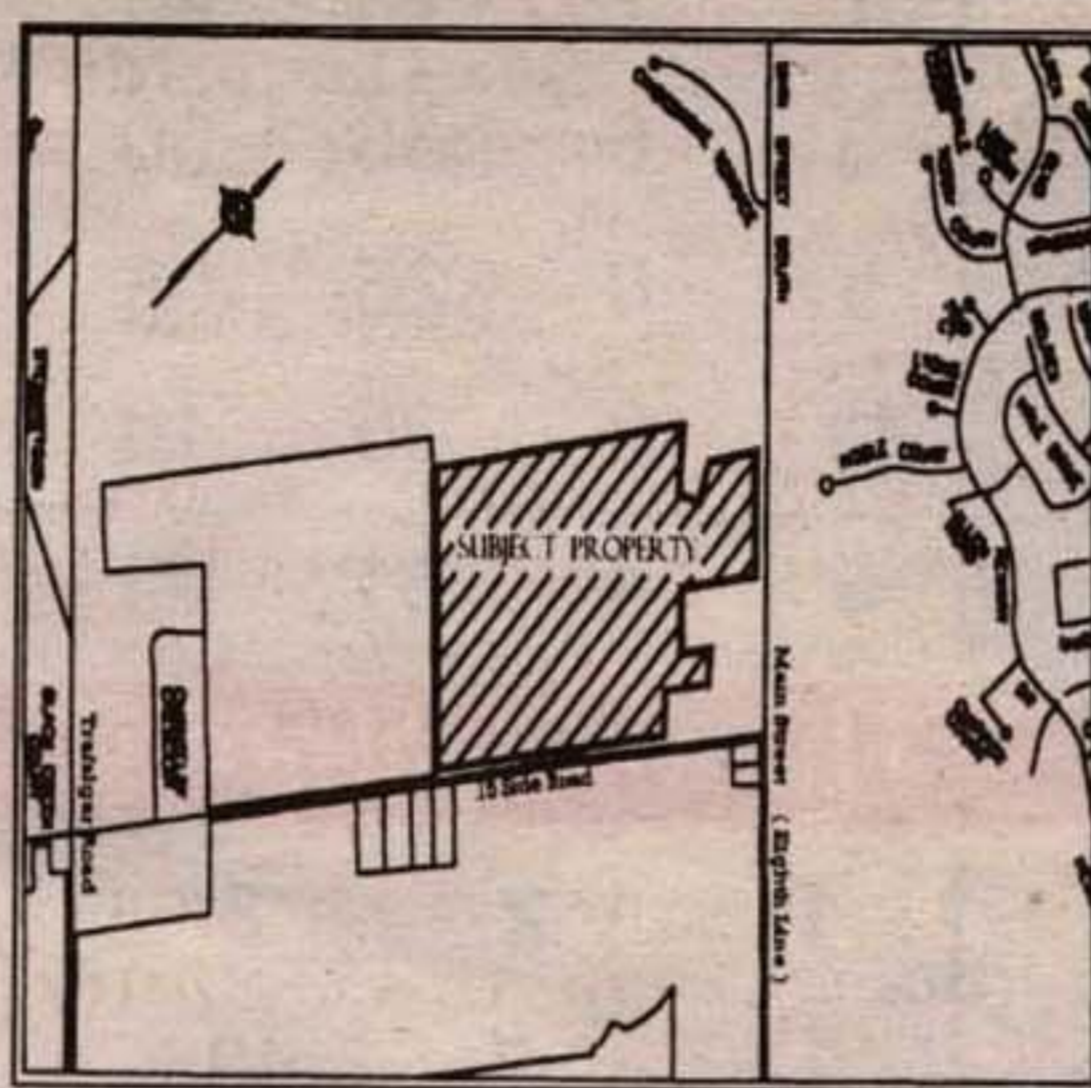

EIGHTH LINE (MAIN STREET)

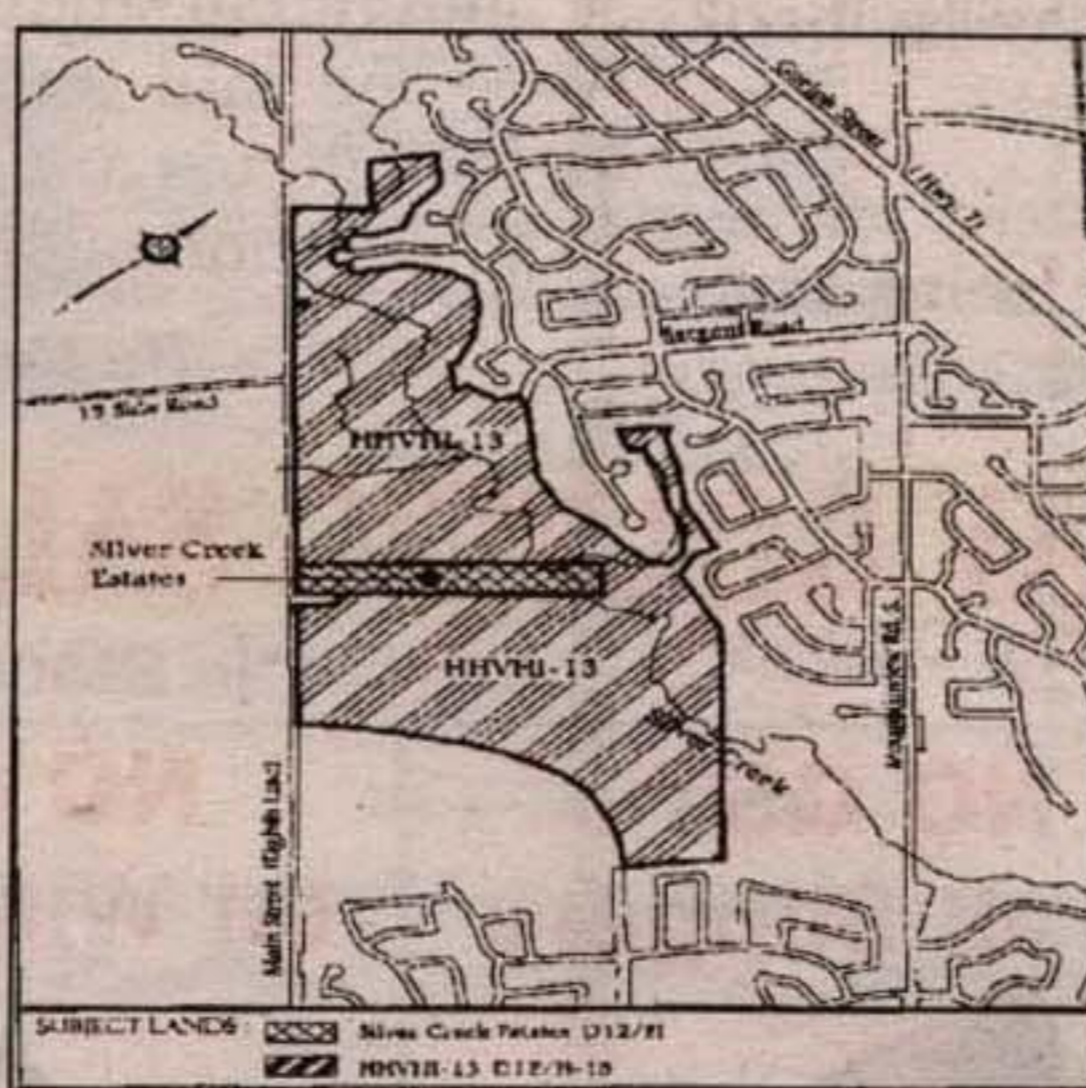
General Committee for the Town of Halton Hills will conduct a Public Meeting to examine and discuss proposed amendments to Zoning By-law 57-91 and two related applications for plans of subdivision. The first application, processed under File 24T-86035B/H by the Region of Halton, proposes the creation of 495 single detached residential lots, 11 residential reserve blocks, 3 neighbourhood park blocks and 3 open space blocks. The second application, processed under File 24T-89013/H by the Region of Halton, proposes the creation of 35 single detached residential lots, 20 residential reserve blocks and one open space block.

The subject properties are located in Georgetown South and are bounded by Eighth Line (Main Street) to the west, existing residential development to the north and east, existing and proposed plans of subdivision to the south (D12/HHVHI - 10) and agricultural lands and proposed plans of subdivision to the west (D12/Verdeux and D12/Arbor Valley). The properties include a considerable portion of the Hungry Hollow Ravine which are not subject to development.

The public is invited to attend the meeting to ask questions and provide comments. If a person or public body that files an appeal of a decision of the Town of Halton Hills in respect of the proposed Zoning By-law Amendments does not make oral submissions at a public meeting, or written submissions, to the Town of Halton Hills before the proposed zoning by-law is adopted, the Ontario Municipal Board may dismiss all or part of the appeal.

Norval residents doubt development process will change

However, the suggestions did not sit well with residents, who feel the pumping station jeopardizes the area's natural setting.

"I put no value in the mayor's meeting," said Stella Bryant, president of the Norval Community Association. "The process will not change. Staff is supposed to be driven by council but this council is being driven by its staff and that's not the way it's supposed to be. (The process) won't change until they're forced to change it."

Councillor Kathy Gastle also denounced the process that allowed the pumping station to be built on valley lands.

"It's really unfortunate that staff recognized all these anomalies, as they called them, but they didn't correct them during the process. They just went forward with it," she said. "The frustrating thing is that council haven't really supported this. Even the mayor accepted it as a fait accompli."

Gastle said she would like to see the town adopt a policy that would have all valley lands and conservation lands automatically given to the municipality when a developer puts an application forward.

"The environment has to take precedence over what we are doing (in terms of development) in this town," Gastle said. "It's time we started listening to our public."

Halton Hills Mayor Marilyn Serjeantson said the meeting was intended to examine and improve the development process.

"We know there are gaps in the process that need to be refined and fixed. That's why we had to go through the process, to see how we can make it better," she said. "We can all learn from this experience."
