

robes for his love ofwoodworking

In these tough economic times, few people have the courage to Lleave the security of their jobs and turn their hobbies into a full-time profession.

But that's precisely what 28-yearold Hendrik Varju of Erin Township did- walking away from a promising law career to turn his love of woodworking into a new career.

Since childhood, he had always been encouraged to be a lawyer, Varju says, adding his parents meant well instilling this goal in him; they wanted him to have opportunities they never had. However, during the years he spent at Queen's University and Osgoode Hall studying for his degree, Varju says he felt disillusioned. When he began to practise law at a small Toronto firm, Varju says he was miserable.

"I was in the wrong world," he says.

Believing there was a lack of ethics in the profession, he resigned from the Law Society soon after Christmas 1996.

"It wasn't that I wasn't good at it. It just wasn't me," he says.

Varju and his wife moved to Etobicoke where he began his business in his in-laws' basement. Earlier this year, the Varjus moved to Erin Township because the home industry bylaws there are ideal, he says.
