

Raiders drop OT heartbreaker to Blues

While the rest of the Provincial Jr. A Hockey league struggles to solve the Bramalea Blues, the Georgetown Raiders wouldn't mind a post-season meeting.

The Raiders have earned three of a possible six points this year against the Blues, who sport a 17-2-5 record. The latest point came Tuesday in a 5-4 overtime loss in Bramalea.

Kyle Amyotte spoiled any chance of Georgetown beating Bramalea for the second time this year with a goal 1:18 into overtime. The Raiders are now 11-12-1 but the point was a valuable one in the tight Western Conference race.

The Blues took a 2-0 lead on a pair of power-play goals but Peter Veltman, who had three points, cut the lead in half with six minutes remaining in the opening period. Bramalea regained its two-goal edge with another power-play marker, however, Veltman and Gene Spadaro tied the game before the end of the period.

The teams traded goals in the second, with Rob LaRose scoring on a Raider power play, and then played through a scoreless third.

Novice II Raiders

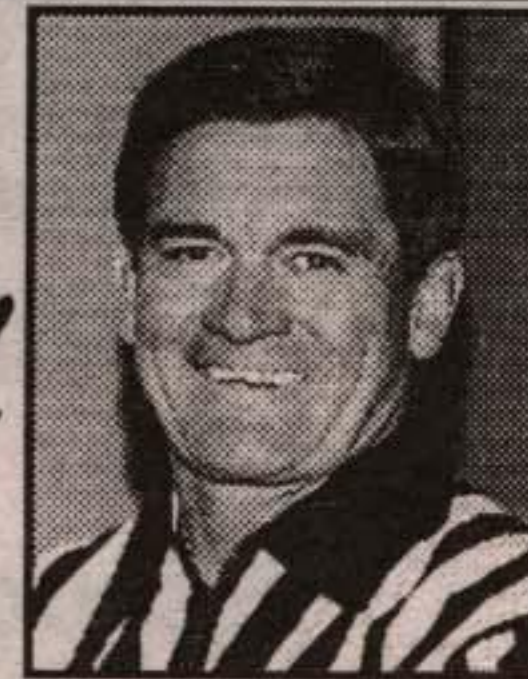

PORTUGAL!

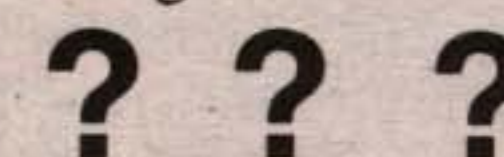
