We do not regret NATO's (and more specifically, Canada's) decision to use force to halt Yugoslavian President Slobodan Milosevic's assault against ethnic Albanians. Furthermore, we believe the NATO forces must keep the pressure on the Yugoslavian madman to stop his murderous ways.

Approximately 800,000 Kosovars have already been displaced and that number is rising by the minute. These people, given a choice, would likely prefer to resume their lives in their homeland. NATO, and the typically silent United Nations, should do all they can to ensure this happens.
