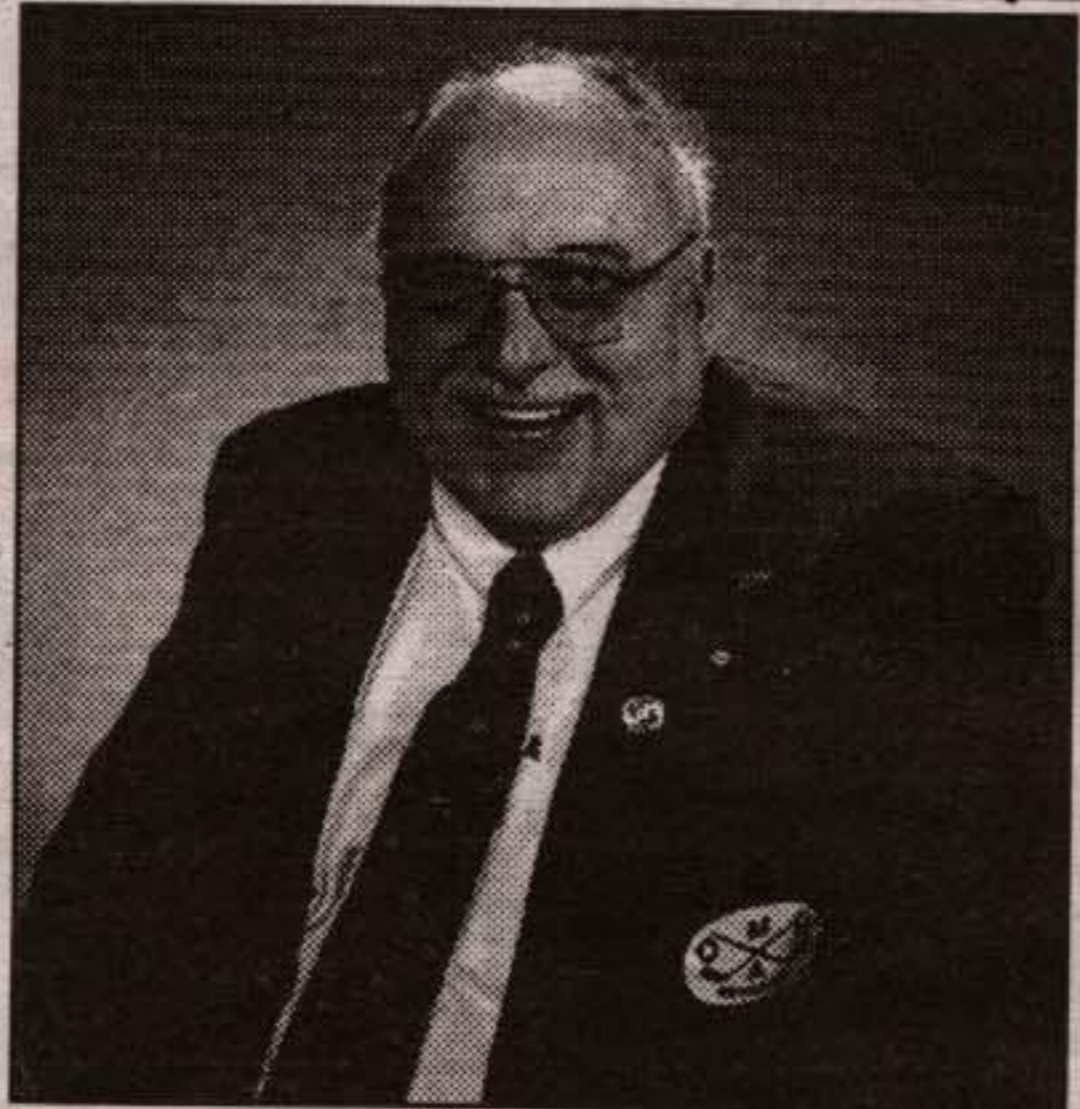

FRONT TEETH ARE VERY VALUABLE!
A front tooth is worth \$309,000 or .12 cents, depending on how much you figure, according to a survey by the American Association of Endodontists, reported in the Chicago Tribune. The materials that go into making up the average tooth-calcium, phosphorous, water etc. cost only about .76 cents to buy. But in a survey of 1,023 men and women taken by the association, people put a much higher value on their teeth. Nearly one-fourth of the respondents said that they wouldn't sell a tooth for anything. About 15 percent said that they'd want at least \$1 million, but the rest were not so demanding and the average asking price from the entire groups came out to \$309,000!
