Board votes against closing schools

Director of Education Dusty Papke said the board is now in the same position it was at the beginning of the accommodation process.

"The board has an accommodation problem and it still has an accommodation problem. I don't know where we go from here."

The board must eliminate about 1,800 surplus elementary spaces to obtain provincial funding for new schools.

Gardiner said the decision contradicts an earlier decision of the board to minimize the use of portables. She said she expects as many as 50 portables (up from the 16 currently in use) at Georgetown schools in the next two to three years. She said north Oakville will also see a big increase in portables.

In addition to the overcrowding issue, Gardiner said the decision could have a financial impact as well.

"We may have just thrown \$3.5-million out the window," Gardiner said in reference to the Educational Development Charges, the provincial funding used to buy school sites. In order to receive the grant, the board must, over a five-year period, have an average enrollment that equals its schools' capacity.

Papke said initial projections showed the board would get the EDCs— qualifying by 26 students. That leaves room for less than 1/10 of one per cent in error for the projections.

Voting against closing the schools were Burlington trustees Bird, Michael Ellis, Oakville trustees Lynn Roberts and Sheila Flook and Marianne Hawthorne.

Voting in favor of closing the two schools were Gardiner, Milton trustee Erica Andrews, Burlington trustee David Abbott and Oakville trustees Peter Petrusich and Debbie Marklew.
